NEW BUSINESS

Item #1: Welcome Back Day

ANNOUNCEMENTS AND REMARKS

Rep. Webster expressed concern about after deadline bills: with only a few bills printed at this point, she questioned whether it made sense to further dilute drafting efforts by letting in more bills. Mr. Kennedy reported that virtually all study bills that had been received in his office had now been completed. This was the first priority established in consultation with the l13th Legislative Council; and the Office was now proceeding with the budget bills, which had been received late last week, and all other drafting requests.

Speaker Martin announced that the Council would meet next Tuesday, January 31, following the morning legislative session, and asked Mr. Silsby to make a presentation at that time.
