Speaker Martin reported that the Governor had issued a request to all Cabinet and non-Cabinet agencies to make additional reductions in their FY 90 and FY 91 budgets. The Legislature's additional target is \$850,000. He further noted that the Legislature's supplemental request for the current fiscal year of \$259,180 had not been included in the Governor's supplemental budget. Finally, he announced that the Legislature's budget hearing before the Appropriations Committee was scheduled for the next day, Tuesday, February 6, at 1 p.m. Copies of the materials prepared for the Appropriations Committee were distributed to Council members.
