SECRETARY'S REPORT

The Summary of the April 8, 1991, Council meeting was accepted and placed on file. (Motion by Sen. Dutremble; second by Rep. Mayo; unanimous).

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Sally Tubbesing, Executive Director, presented the following item for the Council's consideration:

Item #1: Legislation Related to Handling of the Errors Bill

Ms. Tubbesing noted that the Council had directed Mr. Kennedy last fall to develop draft legislation in pursuit of two goals: eliminating all purely technical errors from the Errors bill in order to reduce the size of the bill and focusing the efforts of the Judiciary Committee on those errors which require determination of a substantive question or legislative intent.

Mr. Kennedy reported that he had also determined in the course of his work, that it was important to amend the Rules of Construction in the statutes to clarify that current drafting policies regarding both the use of "shall" and "must" and severability clauses are not intended to cause substantive changes.

In response to a request for clarification, Mr. Kennedy noted that a servability clause in a statute allows a court to construe that if any portion of the statute is found to be unconstitutional, the rest of the statute is still in effect.

Motion: That the substance of the two bill drafts be approved. (NOTE: the bills did not require Council approval for introduction as after deadline bills). (Motion by Sen. Dutremble; second by Sen. Clark; unanimous).

REPORTS FROM COUNCIL COMMITTEES

OLD BUSINESS

Item #1: After Deadline Requests

Before proceeding with consideration of After Deadline Requests, Rep. Marsano asked for a status report from the Revisor. Mr. Kennedy responded that 27 bills had yet to be drafted; 121 were in production; and 187 were out for signature. In addition, the Office currently had 127 Committee Amendments "in the pipeline." He noted that virtually all of the bills to be drafted had problems which precluded completion of full drafts and that sponsors had been notified of this.

The Council's action on After Deadline Requests is summarized on the attached list.

Item #2: Legislative Budget

Rep. Whitcomb indicated that he had developed several additional suggestions regarding the legislative budget. At the Chair's request, this item was tabled until completion of the rest of the agenda.
