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

PART 1

INTRODUCTION

This volume contains the bill requests submitted by Legislators before cloture on October 3, 2007 that are proposed for introduction in the Second Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature. The requests are listed in Part 2 and are arranged by subject matter. Each request is indicated by a title, followed by a short summary of the bill request and, where applicable, cross-references to other requests that appear to be related. We have also identified requests that may be precluded by Joint Rule 217 with cross-references to the possible conflicting LDs from last session.



The graph above shows categories of bill requests for this session and the past three second regular sessions.

Two years ago, in 2005, out of a total of 496 precloture legislator requests to review, 174 were admitted at the initial screening and 37 at the appeal screening for a total of 211 legislator bills accepted.

Four years ago, in 2003, out of a total of 362 precloture legislator requests to review, 109 were admitted at the initial screening and 21 at the appeal screening for a total of 130 legislator bills accepted.

Six years ago, in 2001, out of a total of 489 precloture legislator requests to review, 79 were admitted at the initial screening and 59 at the appeal screening for a total of 138 legislator bills accepted.

This year a total of 47 agency and independent bills were filed, as compared to 64 in 2005, 69 in 2003 and 102 in 2001.

Additionally, the workload of the Legislature includes 169 carryovers for the upcoming session, as compared to 233 in 2005, 164 in 2003 and 122 in 2001.

Article IV

Part Third

Legislative Power.

Section 1. To meet annually; power of Legislature to convene itself at other times; extent of legislative power. The Legislature shall convene on the first Wednesday of December following the general election in what shall be designated the first regular session of the Legislature; and shall further convene on the first Wednesday after the first Tuesday of January in the subsequent evennumbered year in what shall be designated the second regular session of the Legislature; provided, however, that the business of the second regular session of the Legislature shall be limited to *budgetary matters*; legislation in the Governor's call; legislation of an emergency nature admitted by the Legislature; legislation referred to committees for study and report by the Legislature in the first regular session; and legislation presented to the Legislature by written petition of the electors under the provisions of Article IV, Part Third, Section 18. The Legislature shall enact appropriate statutory limits on the length of the first regular session and of the second regular session. The Legislature may convene at such other times on the call of the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House, with the consent of a majority of the Members of the Legislature of each political party, all Members of the Legislature having been first polled. The Legislature, with the exceptions hereinafter stated, shall have full power to make and establish all reasonable laws and regulations for the defense and benefit of the people of this State, not repugnant to this Constitution, nor to that of the United States.



Comments: This bill would provide that a municipality containing a chartered village corporation is entitled to an adjustment to its state valuation for purposes of revenue sharing and education funding if the municipality is required to rebate a certain portion of the property taxes collected within the village corporation territory back to the village corporation.

Under current law, the assessor must subtract from a municipality's valuation certain values associated with property in various tax increment financing districts. The discounting or sheltering of those values provides an advantage to those municipalities and a relative disadvantage to their municipal counterparts with respect to school subsidy, municipal revenue sharing and county assessments. Further, the study commission will make recommendations on how the Department of Education may support communities, children and working parents through the development of pilot programs for alternative activities for school-age children.




