ORDERED, the House concurring, that there be paid to John S. Nelson, Representative of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians, and to Joseph A. Nicholas, Representative of the Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians, on account of compensation, the sum of one hundred dollars, plus mileage. (S. P. 29)
