# SENATE

Tuesday, January 29, 1963 Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Victor P. Musk of Augusta.

On motion by Mr. Ferguson of Oxford, the Journal of January 24 was read and approved.

It is with great personal gratitude on behalf of myself and the citizens of the State of Maine, that I transmit to you herewith, a communication from the Honorable Percival P. Baxter, former Governor of the State of Maine, received by me on January 22, 1963. This communication is self-explanatory and sets forth the desire of the Honorable Percival P. Baxter to obtain concurring Legislative action in the acceptance of a gift of 7,764 acres of forest land to the State of Maine.

On September 5, 1962, consistent with the authority vested in me by the provisions of the Revised Statutes, Chapter 11, Section 16, the Governor and Executive Council accepted on behalf of the State of Maine, a gift of this tract of land, to be added to previous gifts of forest land which now comprise the Baxter State Park.

An Act will be proposed for your consideration and concurrence in acceptance of this gift, in keeping with Mr. Baxter's request. I submit Mr. Baxter's generous offer with the observation that favorable consideration of the accompanying legislation is in the public interest and respectfully recommend your earliest favorable action.

This act of great generosity on the part of Mr. Baxter is further exemplification of the donor's continued interest in the preservation of the natural resources of our State for posterity.

#### Letter from Ex-Governor Baxter

Portland, Maine

January 3, 1963

Honorable John H. Reed, Governor and the

Honorable Senators

and Representatives

of the State of Maine.

Without doubt you are familiar with what has been done in the creation of Baxter State Park in the Katahdin region.

Beginning with my communication of March 3, 1931, addressed to Honorable William T. Gardiner, Governor, the State has accepted from me by Legislative Acts gifts totaling 193,254 acres of forest land, forever to be held in Trust for Public Park, Public Recreational and for Public Forestry purposes the same forever to be kept in its Natural Wild State.

Mr. BROOKS of Cumberland: Mr. President and members of the Senate: It is with great personal pride and great pleasure that I present this bill this morning.

In this age of missiles, great technological advances and social upheavals throughout our world, it is very much a pleasure for me to bring to the attention of this Senate and the citizens of Maine once again the fact that within our boundaries we have a State Park consisting of over 200,000 acres, known as Baxter State Park. This State Park in its majesty and beauty is unsurpassed anywhere.

I am sure that the donor of this park and the additional tract of land which is to become a part of this State Park, the Honorable Percival P. Baxter is aware of the full significance that the impact of such a gift has on us and will have on succeeding generations, yes — forever.

Particularly, this gift at this time emphasizes to us what we of this generation are increasingly becoming aware: that is, the importance of the conservation of our natural resources.

In accepting this gift, it must be noted that Percival Proctor Baxter has had the privilege to live to see this great park expanded to its present tremendous size. He must realize too, how much we, the citizens of Maine, appreciate his generosity. Thank you.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair appreciates the remarks of the Senator from Cumberland, S e n a t o r Brooks, and in behalf of the Senate of this State and of the Citizens of Maine, his generosity is again appreciated.

On motion by Mr. Brooks of Cumberland, under suspension of the rules the bill was given its two several readings and passed to be engrossed without reference to a committee, and sent forthwith to the House for concurrence.

Mr. LOVELL of York: Mr. President, in order to show our appreciation of this generosity of Ex-Governor Baxter, I move that the Senate give a rising vote of thanks to Ex-Governor Baxter.

The motion prevailed and a rising vote of thanks was given. Mr. Porteous of Cumberland was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate.

Mr. PORTEOUS of Cumberland: Mr. President and members of the Senate: First of all I would like to be sure that the record is correct and that we do not refer to the Hon. Percival P. Baxter as the late Governor Baxter. I talked to him yesterday and he is very much alive. It is "former Governor Percival P. Baxter."

I would like to inquire of the President if it would not be in order for this body to send a suitable communication to the Honorable former-Governor Baxter thanking him for his generosity and his sincere interest in this State.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair will inform the Senator that, No. 1, the record will be corrected consistent with the Senator's remarks and consistent with the previous remarks of the Senator from Knox, Senator Stilphen; and, secondly, the Chair will inform the Senator that he will be happy to comply with the request and inform former-Governor Baxter of our appreciation.

Baxter of our appreciation. The bill was ordered printed in document form.
