Whereas, it appears to the Senate of the 101st Legislature that the following is an important question of law and the occasion a solemn one, and

Whereas, there is pending before the Senate of the 101st Legislature a bill entitled "An Act Providing Expense Reimbursement for Members of the Legislature" (Senate Paper 159, Legislative Document 435) as amended by Senate Amendment A; and

Whereas, Article IV, Part Third, Section 7, Maine Constitution, provides that

"The senators and representatives shall receive such compensation, as shall be established by law; but no law increasing their compensation shall take effect during the existence of the legislature which enacted it. The expenses of the members of the house of representatives in traveling to the legislature, and returning therefrom, once in each week of each session and no more, shall be paid by the state out of the public treasury to every member, who shall seasonably attend, in the judgment of the house, and does not depart therefrom without leave."

Whereas. it is important that the Legislature be informed as to the constitutionality of the proposed bill; be it therefore

Ordered, that in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution of the State, the Justices of the Supreme Judicial Court are hereby respectfully requested to give the Senate their opinion on the following questions:

QUESTIONS

(1) Is it within the power of the Legislature to provide for the reimbursement of Senators and Representatives for expenses, other than travel, in attendance at daily sessions?

(2) If the answer to the first question is in the affirmative, would the bill, "An Act Providing Expense Reimbursement for Members of the Legislature" (Senate Paper 159, Legislative Document 435) as amended by Senate Amendment A, if enacted by the Legislature, be constitutional?

On motion by Mr. Cyr of Aroostook, the Senate voted to reconsider its action whereby this bill was passed to be engrossed. The same senator then presented S e n a te Amendment "A" and moved its adoption. Senate Amendment "A" was read and adopted. On further motion by the same senator the bill was passed to be engrossed in non-concurrence and sent down for concurrence.

The President laid before the Senate the 2nd tabled and specially assigned matter, (H. P. 833) (L. D. 1220) Bill, "An Act Relating to Registration of Sanitarians," which was tabled on February 13 by the senator from Cumberland, Senator Hinds, pending reference.

Mr. HINDS of Cumberland: Mr. President and ladies and gentlemen: I think so much of the State Government Committee that where this bill has to do with exterminators I would now move that this bill be referred to the Health and Institutional Services Committee in non-concurrence.

The motion prevailed and the bill was referred to the Committee

on Health and Institutional Services in non-concurrence and sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Farris of Kennebec, the Senate voted to take from the table the 19th tabled and unassigned matter, (S. P. 32) (L. D. 26) Resolve, Providing Industrial Accident Payments to Mrs. Jeanne T. Smith of Thomaston, which was tabled by that senator on February 13th pending assignment for second reading.

Mr. FARRIS: Mr. President and members of the Senate: I have an amendment which will be presented to this resolve and it has been discussed with the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Porteous. The sole effect of the amendment would be to provide payments to this widow in accordance with the terms of the Workmen's Compensation A c t rather than making payments in accordance with the terms of the resolve as written. In other words, there are certain contingencies that could occur, such as death or re-marriage of the beneficiary of this award and under the terms of the Workmen's Compensation Act p a yments would terminate, but in the manner in which this is written it would continue for the 258 weeks. I trust that the amendment will receive your acceptance.

Senate Amendment "B" was read and adopted, and the resolve as amended was assigned for second reading on the next legislative day.

On motion by Mr. Couture of Androscoggin, the Senate voted to take from the table, bill, "An Act Relating to Sick Leave to Members of Police Department of City of Lewiston" (H. P. 300) (L. D. 394) tabled by that Senator earlier in today's session pending acceptance of the Leave to Withdraw report; and on further motion by the same Senator, the report was accepted in concurrence.
