SENATE

Tuesday, February 19, 1963 Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Edward F. Allen of Augusta.

On motion by Mr. Letourneau of York, the Journal of January 14 was read and approved.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair is happy to recognize in the Senate Chamber today Ross Bulfinch Lovell and Dean Lovell, sons of the Senator from York, Senator Lovell. Ross Bulfinch Lovell's middle name comes from the last name of the famed architect who designed this capitol building. Ross and Dean, would you stand up and be recognized, please? (Applause)

The Chair is happy to appoint Ross and Dean Lovell as honorary pages of the Senate today. If one of the pages will show them where to be located we will proceed.

The Chair is likewise happy to introduce to the Senate David Porteous, who is the young son of the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Porteous. David, would you stand up and be recognized, please? (Applause)

The Chair appoints David Porteous as an honorary page for today if he would like to serve.

The Chair is proud also to recognize in the Senate Chambers the 4-H group from Buckfield, Maine, who are here today with their leader, Mrs. Tucker.

I know this group has heard a lot of comments about the State of Maine, its good things and its bad features. Too often these days we listen to the bad features or to statistics which tend to put our state in an unfavorable light. I would point out to you in this 4-H group a few facts for your consideration:

The largest producer of moulded pulp plates and containers in the United States is located in Maine. A Portland firm of canners furnishes the baked beans served on the railroad dining cars in the United States. The City of Old Town leads the country in the manufacture of canoes. The largest news-

print producer in this country is located in Maine. We have the largest snowshoe factory, the largest dowel mill and the largest toothpick factory; and I do not need to point out to you young people the tremendous impact of agriculture in this state on our economy.

Congratulations to you. Keep it up, because the future of this state depends on you. Would you stand up, please, and be recognized? May I introduce to you the Senator from Oxford, Senator Pike, and the Senator from Oxford, Senator Ferguson. (Applause)

Mr. FARRIS of Kennebec: Mr. President, at the risk of incurring the possibility of wholesale resignations among fish and game circles, I would like to inquire through the President from a member of the Inland Fisheries and Game Committee as to just what the emergency is under the terms of the Constitution whereby we should immediately permit fishing for smelt in Kingsbury Pond, etc?

The PRESIDENT: The Senator from Kennebec, Senator Farris, poses a question through the Chair to any member of the Senate who may answer if he chooses.

Mr. STILPHEN of Knox: Mr. President, as a member of the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game, I would answer the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Farris, by saying that in order that the fishermen in the Kingsbury Pond-Mayfield area and the tributaries of that pond might avail themselves of the spring run of smelts that it would be necessary to have this

measure enacted as an emergency, otherwise they would not be able to take advantage of this spring's run, since acts not put through as emergency measures would take effect 90 days after the adjournment of the legislature.

Mr. FARRIS: Mr. President, I thank the Senator from Knox, Sen-

ator Stilphen.

Thereupon, a division of the Senate was had, and the resolve, being an emergency measure, and having received the affirmative vote of 32 members of the Senate, was Finally Passed.

The President laid before the Senate the first tabled and today assigned item (H. P. 128) (L. D. 172) Bill, "An Act Providing for Approval of Legislature for Expenditure of Inland Fisheries and Game Expenditures." tabled on February 14 by Senator Edmunds of Aroostook pending passage to be engrossed, and that Senator moved the pending question. Thereupon, the bill was passed to be engrossed.

Mr. Boisvert of Androscoggin was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate.

Mr. BOISVERT: Mr. President and members of the Senate: As you well know, yesterday was election day in the City of Lewiston and two members of this Senate were seeking seats on the city council, and I am happy to say that both of them were successful. Senator Couture has received a mandate for his eleventh term as councilman or alderman for Ward 6 in the City of Lewiston, and Senator Jacques, although it is his first term, has served as alderman in Ward 7; previously he has served six years as an alderman and two years as Mayor of the City of Lewiston. I do believe that congratulations are in order, and I wish that this be entered in the records. Thank you. (Applause)
