HOUSE

Wednesday, January 20, 1965

The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Robert Smith of Augusta.

The journal of yesterday was read and approved.

At this point, a message came from the Senate borne by Secretary Pert of that body, proposing a Joint Convention to be held at 10:15 o'clock in the Hall of the House of Representatives for the purpose of administering to Councilor-elect William Jabine th e oaths required by the Constitution to qualify him to enter upon the discharge of his official duties as Executive Councilor.

On motion of Mr. Binnette of Old Town, the House voted to concur in the proposal for a Joint Convention. The Clerk was charged with and conveyed a message to the Senate to that effect.

The Clerk subsequently reported that he had delivered the message with which he was charged.

Committee on Report of the reporting "Ought Taxation pass" on Bill "An Act to Repeal the Sweet Corn Tax and Laws Relating to European Corn Borer" (S. P. 25) (L. D. 37)

CHAIRMAN REED: The Chair will appoint a Committee to wait upon the new Executive Councilorelect, who due to lack of notification, was unable to attend yesterday's Joint Session, informing him that the 102nd Legislature is now met in convention for the purpose of administering an oath of office to him for the political years of 1965 and 1966.

Thereupon, the Chair appointed the following Committee:

Senator Glass of Waldo

Representative Mitchell of Frankfort.

Senator Glass for the Committee subsequently reported that the Committee had attended to the duty assigned to it, and that Councilor-elect William Jabine would attend forthwith.

Thereupon, the Honorable William Jabine entered the Hall, and in the presence of both branches of the Legislature in Convention assembled, before the President of the Senate, took and subscribed the oaths required by the Constitution to qualify him to enter upon the discharge of his official duties.

The Councilor then withdrew amid the applause of the Convention.

The purpose for which the Convention was called having been accomplished, the Chairman declared the same dissolved.

The Senate retired to the Senate Chamber, amid applause of the House, the members rising.
