JOINT RESOLUTION IN RECOGNITION OF VOCATIONAL EDUCATION

Whereas, February 23, 1967, marks the fiftenth anniversary of the signing of the first National Vocational Education Act by President Woodrow Wilson; and

Whereas, on March 6, 1917, the Seventy-Eighth Legislature of the State of Maine, in its infinite wisdom, saw fit to enact legislation to accept the benefits of said Act and to provide for the promotion of vocational education within our State as an integral part of public education; and

Whereas, through a series of enactments since 1917, such benefits have made possible the development of vocational education to serve Maine people who seek employment or are already employed in trades and industries, agriculture, distribution and marketing, home and office, health and technical occupations;

Whereas, the extension and expansion of vocational and technical educational programs are so vital to this State in serving the training needs in all occupational fields not classified as professional or requir-

ing a college degree; and

Whereas, Public Vocational Educational Programs have provided a means for the development and construction of area vocational schools so necessary to many young and adult persons who are preparing for employment or improvement of their skills; and

Whereas, the State of Maine has long been the beneficiary of Vocational Educational Programs which have contributed immeasurably to the betterment of this State; now therefore, be it

Resolved: That this 103rd Maine Legislature designates February 23, 1967 as the fiftieth anniversary of vocational education in Maine, and takes great pride in recognizing the accomplishments made during the past fifty years and offers legislative support and encouragement to Vocational Educational Programs which are proving to be of greater and greater service to the people of the State of Maine and to the Nation; and be it further

Resolved: That we, the Members of the 103rd Legislature, give special recognition to those vocational educators who faithfully develop and motivate leadership abilities in students enrolled in vocational and technical education. (H. P. 774)

Concerning a Study of Property Tax Administration in Maine

Gentlemen:

This will transmit a report of activities of the Bureau of Public Administration, University of Maine, in furtherance of a study of property tax administration in Maine ordered by the 102nd Maine Legislature in regular session and supported by a \$15,000 appropria-

tions of the special session. The knowledge that such a study is underway may assist the Legislature in its current deliberations.

That there has not been time nor funds sufficient to prepare the final report nor to develop preliminary conclusions and recommendations is regrettable as the subject matter is of vital concern to the State of Maine, its local governments, its property tax payers and citizens, as well as of importance to the Legislature. With but \$15,000 appropriated to begin a study generally thought to involve at least \$50,000 of costs, we have chosen to begin in a deliberate, responsible manner on the complete study as ordered by the 102nd Maine Legislature, awaiting the pleasure of the 103rd Legislature as to its further progress. The subject matter does not lend itself to short-cuts or superficial treatment.

If the study is further supported by the 103rd Maine Legislature, we believe that the research phase can be completed by the end of 1967 and that a necessary understanding of the study through a public education and information program can be accomplished by July 1, 1968.

The Bureau feels that this review can be a fundamental contribution to better Maine government. It is anxious to continue its work to a logical conclusion.
