SENATE

Thursday, July 6, 1967

Senate Called to Order by the President.

Prayer by the Senator from Kennebec, Mr. Jon Lund.

Reading of the Journal of yesterday.

Out of Order Under Suspension of the Rules

Mr. Johnson of Somerset presented the following Order and

moved its passage.

ORDERED, the House concuring, that the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House, and the Majority and Minority Leaders, and Assistant Leaders of the Senate and House be and hereby are authorized during the current biennium to attend the conferences of The National Conference of State Legislative Leaders; and that their necessary expenses be paid from the Legislative Appropriation; and be it further

ORDERED, that the dues of the State of Maine for membership in said Conference be paid from the Legislative Appropriation. (S. P.

726)

Which was Read and Passed. Sent down forthwith for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Johnson of Somerset.

Recessed for thirty minutes.

After Recess

Senate called to order by the President.

Out of order and under suspension of the rules the President laid before the Senate the following papers from the House:

Non-concurrent matter

Bill, "An Act to Authorize Bond issues in the Amount of \$6,380,000 to Provide Funds for S c h o o l Building Construction Under the Provisions of Section 3457 of Title 20, R. S. and \$270,000 to Provide Funds for the Construction of Regional Technical and Vocational Centers Under the Provisions of Section 2356-B of Title, 20, R. S. (H. P. 300) (L. D. 435)

In Senate, June 30, Passed to be Engrossed as amended by Committee Amendment "A" (H-435) and by Senate Amendment "B" (S-321) in non-concurrence.

Comes from the House, Passed to be Engrossed As Amended by Senate Amendment "B" in nonconcurrence.

(On moton by Mr. Johnson of Somerset, the Senate voted to recede and concur.

House Papers Joint Orders

ORDERED, the Senate concurring, that the Legislative Research Committee be directed to study the financial policies, methods of dispersing funds, revenues and expenditures of the State Liquor Commission, and be it further

ORDERED, that the Committee be directed to report the results of such study, together with any necessary recommendations, to the next regular session of the Legislature. (H. P. 1241)

Comes from the House, Read and Passed.

(On motion by Mr. Johnson of Somerset, placed on the Special Legislative Research Table.)

ORDERED, the Senate concurring, that the Legislative Research Committee be directed to study the subject of county salaries purpose of collecting comparative data as to the type and level of work performed, analysis of time, fees and other performed. remuneration or fringe henefits which would be of assistance in the existence of determining inequities and salary trends; and be it further

ORDERED, that the Committee be directed to report their findings and recommendations to the 104th Legislature. (H. P. 1242)

Comes from the House, Read and Passed.
