Mr. LEVINE of Kennebec: Mr. President, I move that this item be indefinitely postponed, and I would like to speak on it.

The PRESIDENT: The Senator from Kennebec, Senator Levine, moves that Item 6-17, Bill, "An Act Appropriating Funds for Union River Anadromous Fish Restoration Program," be indefinitely postponed.

The Senator may proceed.

Mr. LEVINE: Mr. President and Members of the Senate: I don't know if my memory is right or not, but I think we had the same legislation in the regular session. It wasn't passed. Everybody is worrying now because we have too much money in the kitty, I guess, and they want to clean it out, and then they should be able to tax the people more next time, and I feel strongly against it. I feel we ought to try to save all we can, and not to come back and tax the people three or four times as much on their income tax the next session. If we keep on passing all these money bills that is what we will have to do. I would like to have a roll call vote on it.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Hancock, Senator Anderson.

ANDERSON of Hancock: Mr. President and Members of the Senate: For the benefit of Senator Levine, the localities surrounding the river are pledged to come up with \$18,500 on this bill, and the State and Federal will furnish the rest of it. Now, this money is held in escrow until we raise the \$18,500. Believe me, this will be a big thing not only for Hancock County but the State as well. The Chief Biologist of Atlantic Salmon figures that it will pay the State and the locality around \$40,000 a year. I don't see how we can possibly pass

The PRESIDENT: Is the Senate ready for the question?

The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Levine.

Mr. LEVINE of Kennebec: Mr. President and Members of the Senate: It reminds me of the story of a woman who went shopping once with her husband's paycheck. She had some other bills to pay, and when she came home she didn't have anything left. She told her husband about all the bargains she got, but the result wasn't too good because there wasn't any money for groceries left over.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin Senator Bernard.

Mr. BERNARD of Androscoggin: Mr. President and Members of the Senate: I arise in support of the remarks of our good Senator Anderson, who is quite knowledgeable on Sea and Shore Fishery matters, and I would go along with his thinking. I know that the facts concerning this bill are accurate. I would hope that this bill would be approved.

The PRESIDENT: The pending question before the Senate is the motion of the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Levine, that Bill, "An Act Appropriating Funds for Union River Anadromous Fish Restora-tion Program," S. P. 580, L. D. 1707, be indefinitely postponed. A roll call has been requested. Under the Constitution, in order for the Chair to order a roll call, requires the affirmative vote of one-fifth of those Senators present and voting. All those Senators in favor of ordering a roll call will please rise and remain standing until counted.

Obviously more than one-fifth having arisen, a roll call is ordered. The Chair will state the question once more. The pending question before the Senate is the motion of the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Levine, that Item 6-17, S. P. 580, L. D. 1707, be indefinitely postponed. A 'Yes' vote will be in favor of indefinite postponement; a "No" vote will be opposed.

Mr. LEVINE: Mr. President and Members of the Senate: I am not going to try to repeat myself. The only thing I want to mention is that this Legislature didn't see fit in the last session to appropriate \$50,000 for low income families to get a chance to obtain a higher education. We see coming in here now, spending money left and right, the same people that voted against it because they claimed the State couldn't afford to do it. Now we are going to spend a hundred thousand dollars on this bill here to create another agency. The first thing you know, it might run into three, four or five million dollars a year. I would like to have a roll call vote again, please.

Mr. SEWALL of Penobscot: Mr. President and Members of the Senate: While I do concur with some of Senator Levine's remarks in regards to money, it was the opinion of many of us on the shade tree situation in the State of Maine that one of our most valuable, aesthetic assets has been ravaged very severely by the Dutch Elm Disease and that this relatively small amount of money, which supervised by would be the Forestry Division, to encourage the various municipalities throughout the State to replace this very valuable asset is a worthy project. I hope that you would support the committee.
