HOUSE

17-A. Ought not to pass reports. Any bill or resolve, which bears a unanimous ought not to pass notation by the committee to which it has been referred, shall upon notification of such action to both Houses be placed in the legislative files. No further action shall be taken following such disposition unless such bill or resolve is recalled for reconsideration by a vote of two-thirds of both Houses. (S. P. 39)
