**Papers from the Senate  
Non-Concurrent Matter**

Bill "An Act Providing Funds for County Access Road to Katahdin Iron Works" (H. P. 1514) (L. D. 1956) which was referred to the Committee on Transportation in the House on January 24.

Came from the Senate referred to the Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs in non-concurrence.

Murchison of Mattawamkeag and Norman P. Whitzell of Gardiner were duly and legally elected members of the House of Representatives and entitled to seats therein.

Report was read and accepted and the members listed therein declared members of the House.

This Order shall not apply to such bills or resolves as are intended only to facilitate the business of the Special Session. (S. P. 730)
