Tuesday, January 19, 1971
Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Roy W. Moody of Gardiner.

Reading of the Journal of yesterday.

Papers From The House
Non-concurrent Matter

H. P. 107 - Joint Order relative to payment of advances on account of compensation to officers of the Senate and House of Representatives.

In the House January 12, 1971, Read and Passed.

In the Senate January 13, 1971, Indefinitely postponed in non-concurrence.

Comes from the House, that Body having Insisted and Asked for a Committee of Conference, with the following Conferees appointed on its part: Kennedy of Milbridge, Bragdon of Perham, and Jalbert of Lewiston.

Which was referred to the Committee on State Government and Ordered Printed.

Mr. Fortier of Oxford presented, Bill, "An Act Relating to Gasoline Road Tax Credits." (S. P. 90) (L. D. 219)

Which was referred to the Committee on Taxation and Ordered Printed.

Tabled — January 14, 1971 by Senator Chick of Kennebec.

Pending — Passage.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Chick.

Mr. CHICK of Kennebec: Mr. President, it is my understanding that the author of this joint order is drawing up a new order to include the school at Winthrop, which also is a joint champion, so I hope

that some other member of the Senate will ask to have this bill tabled until the next legislative day to give him that opportunity.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Katz.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Katz of Kennebec, retabled and tomorrow assigned, pending Passage.
