The PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Berry. Mr. BERRY of Cumberland: Mr. from

President and Members of the Senate: This order has considerable significance on the several problems affecting county i t government, and I think advisable to call the attention of the Senate to the potential involved here for studying the impact of county government as it is set up now in several fields.

In one area we are seeing more attention being paid to the legal resources to be supplied to the needy people who cannot afford legal resources, and at present these expenses are paid by the county and the court where located. This has become a significant item in some county budgets.

We also have the question arising as to the position of the legislature in approving county budgets. Is this the way to do it? What is the status of county delegations? What is the relationship of the legislature at large to the county as far as the budget is concerned?

Considering the fact that the county, as such, does not have a legislative branch of government, we have a little odd situation here which, for one, has concerned me a great deal in my experience in Augusta. At the local level we have voters and we have a board of we have the legislature and the governor, but at the county level we have only the county commissioners, and we have no legislative body to see what happens at the county level.

Another aspect of the study well should be the judicial system in the several counties. At the present time the judicial system returns to the counties monies, and yet we know the county judicial system is not always handled the way it should be. Its housekeeping is not up to date, the quarters for the courts are really in the hands of the county, which has little at stake here. So the possibility of changing this presents itself as a very attractive situation. Consequently, I think a great deal of attention should be attached to this order, and I would hope that it might survive and become treated by the Legislative Research Committee as it should be.
