SENATE

Thursday, February 15, 1973 Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Douglas Robbins of Augusta.

Reading of the Journal of yesterday.

Joint Order

Out of Order and Under Suspension of the Rules:

On motion by Mr. Sewall of Penobscot,

ORDERED, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourn, they adjourn to Tuesday, February 20, at 10 o'clock in the morning. (S. P. 296)

Which was Read and Passed.

Under further suspension of the rules, sent down forthwith for concurrence.

Papers from the House Non-concurrent Matter

Resolve, Appropriating Funds to the Bath-Brunswick Mental Health Association for a Federally Funded Expanded Program. (S. P. 108) (L. D. 253)

In the Senate February 8, 1973, Passed to be Engrossed as Amended by Committee Amendment "A" (S-7).

Comes from the House, Passed to be Engrossed as Amended by Committee Amendment "A" and House Amendment "A" (H-27) in non-concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Morrell of Cumberland, the Senate voted to recede from its action whereby the Resolve was Passed to be Engrossed.

Mr. KATZ: Mr. President and Members of the Senate: This bill, of course, refers to the New Hampshire border. A good deal of the New Hampshire border is on the western part of the state, and I understand that in this permissive society there has been a certain amount of perambulation and other goings on in the western part of the state. I would just like to raise the question with the Senator from Franklin, Senator Shute, whether he thinks it is proper that the state underwrite the cost of this permissive society or not.

The PRESIDENT pro tem: The Senator from Kennebec, Senator Katz, has posed a question to the Senator from Franklin, Senator Shute, who may answer if he so desires.

The Chair recognizes that Senator.

Mr. SHUTE: Mr. President and Members of the Senate: Since my perambulations of the Maine-New Hampshire border and the Oxford County territory are pretty well limited to fishing in ponds on the border area, I don't know as I am too well acquainted with this. I would suggest that the question might be referred to the Senator from Oxford who has jurisdiction over this part of the wildlands.

The PRESIDENT pro tem: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Sewall.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Sewall of Penobscot, placed on the Special Appropriations Table.
