December 29, 1972 To the Governor, Legislature and People of Maine:

I am very happy to have the opportunity to submit this annual report on the major activities of the Maine State Planning Office. It is a report on a new and unique office in Maine State government; an office which began its operations during a period of great change at the state level.

This formative period for the State Planning Office also was a time for many changes in Maine S t at e Government Organization with a movement away from a fragmented structure which was little more than an aggregate of special and clientele interests with governmental powers toward a system more responsive to the direction of our elected officials.

It was a period in which the State of Maine enacted a series of environmental and land use laws which placed the state among the leaders in "The Quiet Revolution in Land Use Control." It was also a period in which a statewide system of Regional Planning Commissions was established providing a "Regional Home" for every local government in the state.

State planning is mainly concerned with relationships: among the many state agencies, the eleven Regional Planning Commissions, multi-state regional organizations, local governments and private groups. I want to thank all of these groups and individuals for their generous assistance and fine cooperation.
