In accordance with the provisions of Section 451 of Title 36 and the provisions of Sections 3712 and 3713 of Title 20, the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services, with the approval of the State Board of Education, hereby certifies that the total education costs as set forth in sub-section 13 of Section 3712 of Title 20 is \$263.592.065.

A copy of the detailed certification of total education costs is attached. I want to emphasize that the certified amounts were determined in strict compliance with the

provisions of the statutes.

Part I is the certification of education costs and Part II is additional funding needed to meet statutory requirements but not included in the certification of education costs, as defined.
