Mr. HUBER: Mr. President and Members of the Senate: I would simply like to point out that there is an inconsistency in the engrossed version of this bill. The intent and effect of this bill would be to appropriate \$675,000 for the expenses of the legislature, as well as a shift of funds from the Department of the Attorney General to the Department of Human Services. In the section entitled "Appropriation", the figure of \$700,000 remains in the printed bill. This will be corrected in a later bill, essentially in errors and inconsistencies, from the Appropriations Committee. The appropriation for the legislature will be \$675,000.
