January 19, 1979 To the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and Members of the One Hundred and Ninth Legislature of the State of Maine:

SUBJECT: Certification of Sufficient Surplus in Accordance with Public Law, Chapter 721

Chapter 721 of the Public Laws of 1977 requires the State Budget Officer to document and certify to the Legislature on January 20, 1979 whether or not a sufficient surplus for fiscal year 1978-79 will be available to provide the benefits described in Section 6148 (Homestead Tax Relief). In his certification process he (the State Budget Officer) shall take into account all outstanding contingencies.

I have reviewed the current balance of available funds taking into consideration the cost of the Homestead Tax Relief, excess undedicated revenue at December 31, 1978, anticipated favorable revenue performance for the balance of fiscal year 1979, estimated lapsed balances and other available funds at year end.

1 have also examined the known needs for

funds including emergency departmental requests submitted to this office for fiscal year 1979. I have considered the costs of collective bargaining agreements that may need to be reflected in current year costs.

As a result of my evaluation of available information, I certify that, in my opinion, there is sufficient surplus to provide the benefits and to take into account all outstanding contingen-
