Thursday, February 15, 1979 The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Prayer by the Reverend Wesley Woodman of the Congregational Church, Warren.

Reverend WOODMAN: Let us be in the spirit

of prayer. This is the beginning of a brand new day, Lord. You have given us this day to use as we will. We can waste it or grow in its light and in the process be of service to others.
