HOUSE

Wednesday, January 9, 1980 The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker. Prayer by the Reverend Richard Higgins of

We ask for your guidance and direction that when the day is over, we can see the smile of God's approval on that that we have done. Bless each and every one of them, for we lift them before thee asking that you work your will in their lives. In Christ's name we pray. Amen.
