REPORT, HEARING TRANSCRIPT AND RELATED MEMORANDA OF THE JOINT SELECT COMMITTEE ON INDIAN LAND CLAIMS

HOUSE

Thursday, January 10, 1980

The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker. Prayer by James Andrew Magnusson of the Missionary to Japan, Gorham. Mr. MAGNUSSON: Shall we look to Almigh-
