Senator TROTZKY: Mr. President, and Members of the Senate, L. D. 673 started out as a Bill to require the Board of Environmental Protection to consider the economic and energy benefits of a project. Bills like this have been killed session after session, because basically when a project comes in it's the duty of cally, when a project comes in , it's the duty of the Board of Environmental Protection to take a look at what effect that project has on the environment

The Bill that's up for Enactment that I see, basically says that "the commission shall permit the applicant to provide evidence on the economic benefits of the proposal as well as the impact of energy resources.' In other words, it allows the applicant to provide this evidence at a hearing, but the Board in no way is required to act on it. In fact, the Board is not supposed to act on the economic benefits. The Board is supposed to act on the effects on the environment.

To me, this piece of legislation is doing absolutely nothing. We've rejected it time and time in the past, therefore, I hope the Senate would not Enact this. It's unessential. The people on the Board of Environmental Protection can read of the economic benefits, and energy impact of a project in any of the newspapers in the State of Maine.

If the Bill said, they had to consider the economic impact, the energy impact, it would mean something, but they're not required to consider it. In fact, they're not supposed to consider it. They're supposed to, by law, look at the effect the project has on the environment.

This is really totally unnecessary legislation.
