took, Senator Violette offers Senate Amendment "A" to LD 1826 and moves its adoption. Senate Amendment "A" (S-384) Read. The PRESIDENT: The Senator has the floor. Senator VIOLETTE: Thank you, Mr. President. Three years ago I was the sponsor of legislation. islation which established the rights of malt beverage wholesalers in Maine and the rights of certificate of approval holders with whom they did business.

The legislation was intended to prevent suppliers from arbitrarily and capriciously terminating the franchises of their wholesalers. It provided that no franchise agreement could be terminated without just cause. It, also, provided that when a a franchise was terminated that reasonable compensation would be given to the terminated wholesaler.

This Bill is intended to close a possible loophole in that franchise law. Under certain conditions it is possible for two certificate of approval holders to sell the same brand of beer or wine to a different wholesaler than the one who had the franchise for that brand.

This amendment corrects a drafting error, whereby a paragraph in the law was repealed. It was intented that the two paragraphs in LD 1826 would be added to that section and not replace it. Thank you.
