report to the Legislature. The report was mandated by resolve of the 111th Legislature and was prepared with funding from the Bureau of Rehabilitation, Department of Human Services. Additional support was provided by the Maine State Planning Council on Development Disabilities. Each year approximatedly 1500 people with

head injuries are discharged from Maine hospitals. Hospital costs alone for this group exceed \$3 million. The report documents steps we can take to significantly reduce the incidence of head injury and to rehabilitate head injured persons.

We would like to acknowledge the many

Maine citizens who contributed to the work of the Task Force. They share with us a concern for the rising social and economic costs of head injury.
