THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Knox, Senator Chalmers

Senator CHALMERS: Mr. President, I rise to speak to protest the process of county government. I ask you not to vote against the Knox County Budget; it would do the citizens of Knox a disservice, but I really would like just a second of your time to protest the process.

There may have been a logic at some time to this process, but I fail to see the logic now, though some people have tried to show me what the logic is. There is no municipal involvement and no control. I, as a municipal officer, was invited to one public hearing where I was presented with the budget; I didn't have any input at all.

As a Legislator, I went to one meeting and I tried to have some input, and I was told "that's your business now; you do with it what you want-you take the heat!" I came over here and I tried to work on the budget; while it is all very nice to say that if I objected and I asked you all to vote against it, some of you would vote against it—that is not meaningful input.

Why should I vote on the Knox County Budget? Why should you vote on the Knox County Budget? Why should Senator Sewall who has some towns? Why should Senator Perkins who has forty-four residents in Knox county-why should he vote?

I object to the process. I object to the fortynine percent increase in the budget; but this isn't the place to fight that increase. The place to fight would have been back with municipal involvement, not now.

I will vote for the budget under protest. I thank you for listening.

This being an Emergency Measure and having received the affirmative vote of 27 Members of the Senate, with 1 Senator having voted in the negative was FINALLY PASSED TO BE ENACTED and having been signed by the President, was presented by the Secretary to the Governor for his approval.
