Senator PEARSON of Penobscot was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate On the Record.

Senator **PEARSON**: Yesterday was V.E. Day (Victory In Europe) and it went by in this Chamber, unnoticed. As a matter of fact, Mr. Hickey, the Doorman, brought it to my attention this morning, it shouldn't have actually, because it was on T.V. and radio. The Second World War was a central part of most Americans lives. I was but an infant at the time. I do have some recollections of it. A lot of people in here have an awful lot more than I do.

I was fortunate enough, when I was in the service, to have gone to the Little Red School House, so-called, in Rheims where the documents of surrender were signed to General Eisenhower. I have been in nearly all of the areas on the Western Front that were involved in the Second World War. I, like everyone else, was profoundly impacted by that war and the results of what took place afterwards.

I think it is important that we remember, not only those of us close to Americans who died and Canadians and the English speaking world, but also the tremendous toll that was taken on behalf of the Russian people and all of the rest of the world.

When we adjourn, I hope we would do it in memory of those people who lost their lives as a result of the Second World War.
