THE PRESIDENT: The Senator from Cumberland, Senator CLARK, moves the Senate ADHERE

The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Hichens.

Senator HICHENS: I move that the Senate Recede and Concur.

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator from York, Senator HICHENS, moves that the Senate RECEDE and CONCUR.

The Chair will order a Division.

The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Hichens

Senator HICHENS: Mr. President, I request a Roll Call.

THE PRESIDENT: A Roll Call has been requested. Under the Constitution in order for the Chair to order a Roll Call it requires the affirmative vote of at least one-fifth of the Members present and voting.

Will all those Senators in favor of ordering a Roll Call, please rise and remain standing until counted.

Obviously more than one-fifth having arisen a Roll Call is ordered.

The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Andrews. Senator ANDREWS: Thank you, Mr. Presi-dent. Mr. President and Men and Women of the Senate. We have debated this Bill extensively a few days ago so I don't want to prolong the agony of this Bill, I simply want to ask you to once again stick with the votes that we had previously on this issue.

I ask you to vote against the motion to Recede and Concur, for two basic reasons: number one, I think that it is very important that we use prudence and good old fashion common sense when it comes to any bond issue whatever it may be. We don't want to spend a penny more on interest payment than we necessarily have to, there is no problem there

at all. There is a problem when we try to define prudence and common sense with a dollar figure regardless of what it is. A proposal that is fifty thousand dollars under two million dollars as a bond issue is not necessarily that much more imprudent or lacks that much more common sense than a proposal that comes in fifty thousand dollars above two million dollars. So let's reject the notion of an arbitrary dollar figure to define prudence and common sense.

The second argument, Ladies and Gentlemen that has me voting against this motion is that as we all know this law would not have the effect of law. It would have to be a Constitutional Amendment in order for it to make any difference at all to a future Legislature. So, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, in my view a law that doesn't have the affect of law is a definition of an unnecessary law. I ask that you defeat this motion, thank you

THE PRESIDENT: The pending question is the motion by the Senator from York, Senator Hichens, that the Senate Recede and Concur. The Chair recognizes the Senator from

Aroostook, Senator McBreairty. Senator McBREAIRTY: Mr. President, I wish

permission to pair my vote with Senator Trafton. If he were here he would be voting no and I would be voting yes.

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator from Aroostook, Senator McBreairty, requests leave of the Senate to Pair his vote with the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Trafton, If Senator Trafton were here he would be voting No and Senator McBreairty would be voting Yes.

Is it the pleasure of the Senate to grant this leave?

It is a vote.

A Yes vote will be in favor of Receding and Concurring.

A No vote will be opposed.

The Doorkeepers will secure the Chamber. The Secretary will call the Roll.

The Forest Resource Assessment & Marketing Program was created in 1983 by Public Law, chapter 537. Section 2 of that law requires that the Department of Conservation report to the First Regular Session of the 112th Legislature as to the success of the program.

The Forest Resource Assessment & Marketing Program has, in fact, been an unqualified success. A number of useful studies have been completed, or are near completion, which are critical to an organized approach to the development of forest resource industries. In addition, the program has worked closely with a number of firms in realizing specific forest resource related development projects. A number of these which should begin construction soon account for approximately \$155 million in construction costs and hundreds of jobs.

A more detailed report of the activities of the Program is attached.

Senator GAUVREAU: Thank you Mr. President. Men and Women of the Maine Senate, I rise this morning with respect to an item which was on supplement number three, L.D. 817.

This morning the Senate accepted the unanimous recommendation of the Committee on Labor that L.D. 817, "An Act Concerning Notification Under the Workers Compensation Ought Not to Pass. I respect and accept Laws'' the Ought Not to Pass. I respect and accept the decision of the Committee.

This is a bill that Senator Matthews sponsored and I was pleased to be a co-sponsor, I very seldom rise regarding bills of this nature which I am on the wrong side of a unanimous report, but I do think that the Bill addresses a basic problem which will not go away.

Currently under our Workers' Compensation Law an injured worker has only thirty days after he or she is injured in which to report the injury to his or her employer. Now in the vast majority of cases this rule makes a great deal of sense, but there are certain injuries: soft tissue, other types of injuries which in fact are latent in nature and which might be dismissed by the employee as insignificant, however with the passage of time those injuries take on a different nature and sometimes require hospitalization or in fact become disabling. Now the employee under a perfect system might routinely file reports with the employer on all injuries, but as a practical matter many employees have legitimate concerns for their job safety if they routinely report such minor injuries. On a rare occasion, but it does happen with disturbing frequency, injured workers may in fact be forever precluded from filing what otherwise would be a completely mandatorius claim due to the so-called "thirty day rule"

As a result of that all of society bears the cost because the injured worker will have to apply for general assistance or welfare rather than receive compensation from the party which was directly responsible for the injury, to whit the employer.

I recognize that this is not perhaps the year that this matter will receive Legislative solution because of the thrust of the Governor's package and other initiatives to reduce the cost of Workers' Compensation.

I only point out that we are not talking about a great deal of money here, what we are talking about are basic fundamental issues of fairness, so that issue will not go away.

I just wanted to bring that matter to the attention of the Senate. Thank you.
