Senate at Ease

Senate called to Order by the President.

Subsequently, Senator **CLARK** of Cumberland reported that she had delivered the message which she was charged.

Senator **VIOLETTE** of Aroostook was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate On the Record.

Senator **VIOLETTE**: Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. It is with some degree of apprehension that I rise to make these comments but because of my great concern for this issue I feel that I must.

I want to express to my colleagues here in the Senate my disappointment with respect to the President's recent decision with respect to the proposed I.T.C. quotas with respect to the footwear industry. I feel a great deal of disappointment that the President has decided neither to institute recommendations of the I.T.C. with respect to quotas or tariffs but quite frankly, irrespective of those two alternatives, he then proposed nothing else.

As a Democrat, I must say that I'm sensitive to criticism of the President of the United States, so I guess I'm quite surprised to read the comments of the good Senator from the State of Maine, Senator Cohen, and other members of the Congressional delegation, who was their leader, in fact, President and by the comments of Senator Cohen in today's paper to the affect that he is chastising the President because he is (quote) "grossly insensitive" (unquote) to the needs of the American people in this Country.

Senator Cohen, Congressmen McKernan and

Congresswoman Snow have repeatedly, in press releases and press conferences, stated the need to meet with the President to deal with this issue. I guess what matters is results.

It is obvious that the three members, Republican members of the Congressional delegation, this is a political decision, the President decided to make a decision that was not in the best interest of this State, they are incapable of bringing their influence to bear upon this Administration and so, unfortunately, yesterday the shoe dropped on the people of the State of Maine.

I want to share with you a few numbers that are very concerning and I think, quite frankly, point out the picture here and support my arguments.

In 1977, President Carter signed into trade law restrictions with Taiwan and Korea. These trade restrictions lasted 4 years — until 1981. In 1981, President Reagan had the alternative to continue them — or not — and decided not to. In 1977, when President Carter, started those proposed trade restrictions, there were 17,000 shoe jobs in Maine. By 1981, just 4 years later, there were 18,600 shoe industry jobs in Maine, when President Reagan decided not to renew as he had the right to do at that time.

Now some 4 years later, in 1985, there are 12,500 shoe industry jobs in Maine — 6,100 jobs lost in this State — 33% of all the shoe industry jobs that we have lost in the last 4 years is directly because of the inability, first of all with the President to deal with this issue — and quite frankly, the inability of the Republican members of the Congressional delegation to bring proper influence to bear to help save what is an intricate part of our society.

I just want to share with this Body, and with the people of the State of Maine my concern that in these trade matters — the inability of the Members of our Congressional delegation to bring influence to bear upon their President — their leader — to deal with the shoes, the lumber wood product industry and potato industry — as we have seen a very substantial number of our industries in this State, be detonated. It is a direct result of the inability of the Congressional delegation to bring proper influence upon their Leader — their President — to save Maine jobs. Thank you.

Senator **PERKINS** of Hanock was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate On the Record.

Senator **PERKINS**: Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I share with the good Senator from Aroostook, Senator Violette's concern for the shoe industry — and of course — to all of my colleagues here in this room, share the frustration.

One of the frustrations that we all share is that some of our trade areas have been weakened throughout this nation — and one of the reasons for that weakening is the strengthening of our dollar. We strengthen the dollar and we set our policies — and we stick by these policies. I think no one is more frustrated than our Congressional delegation and they have tried very hard — as we all have in this Body to help our constituency.

The good Senator from Aroostook has scheduled a conference in Aroostook and neighboring Canada in the near future to discuss the problems of our lumber and agriculture and our fishing industries. We anxiously await the results of that conference and are hopeful that this conference will heal and lessen the tensions in those industries.

As long as there are subsidies and there are differences in policies between two countries, there will be differences in the marketing policies, as well.

If we harken back to the time of the wheat freeze, we think of farmers that went under then because of the freeze, and because it was hard for our Congressional delegation was powerless to change that then, as they are,

even though the majority in votes was held by a different party — and we had feelings about that as well.

We want you to know that we share the frustrations — and we voice them as best we can. Congressman McKernan, himself, spent this past week — if I recall — in Canada trying to solve the fishing problems between the two countries.

So as we stand here in frustration for our shoe industry — we are still in a positive position because our unemployment rate is down to 5.6 — the lowest it has been since 1968. So while there are bad things — there are good things, as well, and we're standing here as a free country, proud of our economy and hopeful that we have the Yankee initiatory to rise above it and come up with something which is good for our State, and for our Country, as well. Thank you.

On motion by Senator **STOVER** of Sagadahoc, the Honorable **CHARLES P. PRAY** declared the First Confirmation Session of the First Regular Session of the 112th Legislature **ADJOURNED SINE DIE** at 4:22 p.m.
