SUBJECT: DRAFT AREA RECOMMENDATION REPORT (ARR)

A copy of the draft ARR is being sent to you under separate cover. The draft ARR documents the application of the region-to-area screening methodology to the regional geologic and environmental data contained in the Regional Characterization Reports and identifies candidate areas and proposed potentially acceptable sites for the nation's second high-level nuclear waste repository.
