THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Baldacci.

Senator BALDACCI: Mr. President. I would pose a parliamentary inquiry to the Chair. Is the motion to Recede properly before this Body, after having voted to Recede and Concur, and that motion having failed?

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair would respond that the motion to Recede carries precedence over the motion to Recede and Concur. In the opinion of the Chair, the motion to Recede is proper.

The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Baldacci.

Senator BALDACCI: Mr. President. I would request a Roll Call.

THE PRESIDENT: A Roll Call has been requested. Under the Constitution, in order for the Chair to order a Roll Call, it requires the affirmative vote of at least one-fifth of those Senators present and voting.

Will all those Senators in favor of ordering a Roll Call, please rise in their places and remain standing until counted.

Obviously, more than one-fifth having risen, a Roll Call is ordered.

The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Diamond.

Senator DIAMOND: Mr. President and Members of the Senate. By accepting the motion to Recede, you will be reversing our position which we had last Monday, and putting us back in the position to decide which way we want to go. In fact, the Recede motion that is now before us, for those people who might have been concerned about the Amendment which was added on in the House, to take off the Emergency Preamble, that worry can be put to rest. If we Recede and get back into the position where we are now talking about what the House did. The motion to Recede is not a parliamentary trick, it is simply that a Recede motion takes precedence over Recede and Concur. My only reason for doing that was seeing the vote which just came out, which seemed to be somewhat larger and in discrepancy with the last one taken. It appeared to me, and the thought entered my mind, that possibly there was some concern about what the other Body had done by adding their Amendment.

If that is the case, then because this issue is so important to so many people, I wanted to make sure that I, at least, and others had the chance to vote on what we had voted on before. If that was your concern, you now have the chance to make that difference in our vote. So, that is my only reason for moving to Recede.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Baldacci.

Senator BALDACCI: Mr. President. I would encourage the Senate to vote against the motion to Recede and then deal with the motion to Adhere.

THE PRESIDENT: The pending question before the Senate is the motion of the Senator from Cumberland, Senator DIAMOND that the Senate RECEDE.

A Yes vote will be in favor of the motion of Senator Diamond of Cumberland to Recede.

A No vote will be opposed.
