I have the honor to transmit herewith an initiated bill, "AN ACT Regarding the Generation of Electric Power and High Level Radioactive Waste," and the results of the examination by this office of the initiative petitions relative to it.

The minimum number of valid signatures required to initiate this legislation is 46,030. Since these petitions were filed prior to the November 4, 1986 gubernatorial election, they fell under the requirements of the 1982 gubernatorial vote. These petitions were filed by the constitutionally mandated date of January 22, 1987. After extensive review we have determined the number of valid signatures is 53,286.

In view of the foregoing determination, I hereby certify that these petitions have met the constitutional requirement of the minimum of 46,030 valid signatures. Since the petitions have previously satisfied the constitutional requirements in all other respects, under the provisions of Article IV, Part Third, Section 18, of the Constitution of Maine, I do hereby declare this initiative petition to be valid.

In the event the Legislature rejects this initiative proposal, a referendum election will be called for November, 1987.
