Enclosed please find the annual report evaluating the revenue loss due to the tax exemption on ethanol-blended fuel. This report is required by 36 MRSA \S 2915.

For the 1986 calendar year, the tax rate on ethanol-blended fuel was llg per gallon. This rate reflects a 3g exemption from the 14g per gallon gasoline tax rate.

There were no reported sales of ethanol-blended fuel in Maine for this period. Therefore, there was no loss of Highway Fund revenue attributable to this exemption.
