Dear President Pray and Speaker Martin:

It is with pleasure that I provide you this copy of "A Supplemental Program for Corridors of Statewide Economic Significance."

This Program outlines our proposal to make up in federal highway funding, address on Maine's needs regionally transportation significant highways and to deal with our extraordinary bridges, while at the same time respecting the needs on other portions of the state's highway system.

The need for these improvements was clearly identified by the Governor's Economic Development Task Force and is clearly supported by MDOT's own

pavement management analyses.

As this Program indicates, we concur with the Task Force recommendation that funding for these projects come from an increase in the motor fuel tax. Our estimates indicate that a 5-cent per gallon increase will be needed if we are to responsibly address the needs identified in this program.

As you review this Program and consider its recommendations, I or members of my staff, will be happy to discuss any questions or concerns which may arise. We strongly feel that this Program in concert with MDOT's biennial Transportation Investment Program, offers us an opportunity to make real progress in addressing Maine's transportation needs on the corridors of statewide significance and the extraordinary bridges, along with addition improvements on the remainder of the highway system. additional
