ANNIVERSARY OF THE FOUNDING OF THE NATIONAL

SOCIETY OF THE SONS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION

WHEREAS, on April 30, 1889, the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution was founded in New York City; and
