But two nights ago, police officers were on TV talking about picking up people, enforcing the law, and fining them \$100 if they have these milk crates. So, hopefully, the law will be read to as a public service announcement to the people of the State of Maine, that it is not against the law, that university students that use them for storage of albums, or storage, or whatever else, that it's not a \$100 fine, the Legislature didn't pass it.

But the dairy industry tread on very thin ice, and this is a warning to them and the public, that this shouldn't happen again, a misrepresentation. Thank you Mr. President.
