The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Fairfield, Representative Gwadoskv.

Representative GWADOSKY: Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House: Several years ago, when the laws were changed within the state of Maine to do away with billboards, the Maine Travel Information Advisory Council was established to oversee what was then to be called "The Official Business Directional Signs" as well as to provide advice to the Department Transportation on various rules that were going to of be interpreted for off-premise signs. The current makeup of the Maine Travel Information Advisory Council deals with a number of people from various industries --- there is one from lodging, one from restaurants, one from recreation, one from agriculture, one from environment, one from the historical society and one from sign makers. I, like many of you, have had questions over the years by individual constituents and business people who have had constituent concerns as to how get the most appropriate sign located. Currently, there is a review being conducted by DOT as to where we stand right now in this entire scheme of things and we thought it might be appropriate to add two legislators, one from the House and one from the other body, on to this Travel Information Advisory Council. In fact, that is what this amendment would do. It would put a member chosen by the Speaker and a member chosen by the President of the Senate who would become a full-time members of the Travel Information Advisory Council.

This council does not meet an inordinate amount time, I believe it is less than half a dozen times a year, but I think it would allow the council important feedback from your constituents and mine by virtue of the fact that we will have a couple of legislators on that particular council.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the Representative from Eliot, Representative McPherson. the

Representative McPHERSON: Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House: I realize it is late and it is Friday afternoon but I do feel that I should convey to you my feelings which I expressed in the committee. My opposition to the two legislators on this advisory council should be on the study. I just feel that it is an expansion at this time when state government should be growing smaller if anything. Т feel that the legislators can help as far as the study but beyond that, being permanently on that council -- I don't feel there is any need for it.

Any problems that I have ever had with signs along the highway, a call to DOT usually has taken care of it.

I feel that the original amendment that came from the committee is the way to go, which is to leave the legislators on for the study and, at the end of the study, they are off the council.
