The Following Joint Resolution: H.P. 610  
JOINT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING THE INTERNATIONAL  
COMMITTEE OF THE RED CROSS AND RED CRESCENT  
MOVEMENT AND THE LEAGUE OF THE RED CROSS AND

RED CRESCENT SOCIETIES TO FULLY RECOGNIZE THE  
MAGEN DAVID ADOM SOCIETY

WE, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Maine in the First Regular Session of the One Hundred and Fourteenth Legislature, now assembled, most respectfully present and petition the International Committee of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement and the League of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, as follows:

WHEREAS, since 1949 the International Committee of the Red Cross has repeatedly refused to formally recognize the Magen David Adom Society, the Israeli equivalent of other International Red Cross societies; and

WHEREAS, the International Committee of the Red Cross mandates the fulfillment of 10 formal requirements for recognition under the terms of the XVII International Red Cross Conference held in Stockholm, Sweden in 1948; and

WHEREAS, of those 10 conditions, the Israeli Magen David Adom Society has met 9, the exception being the requirement that the society display one of the 3 symbols currently in use as Red Cross emblems; and

WHEREAS, the symbols currently in use, red cross, red crescent and a red lion and sun, reflect the differences in religious and cultural values of the host countries where the Red Cross Societies are found and the Israeli request for an emblem specific to its culture mirrors the need of the Moslem countries to use their accepted symbol; and

WHEREAS, Israel has requested that the Magen David Adom, Red Star of David, be accepted as the emblem of its national society, with the rationale being greater recognition and acceptance within Israel as a currently accepted protective symbol; and

WHEREAS, acceptance of Magen David Adom and its emblem by the International Committee of the Red Cross and the League of the Red Cross Societies is vital to its function as an emergency relief agency during times of peace and conflict; and

WHEREAS, the American Red Cross has formally recognized Magen David Adom as an exceptionally strong humanitarian organization fully qualified for formal recognition and equal status with other members of the League of the Red Cross Societies; and

WHEREAS, the Magen David Adom Society petitioned for membership during the International Red Cross Quadrennial Conference held in Geneva in 1986 and rather than accepting their application after 25 years of delay, the conference chose to reject their application with the claim of a need for a uniform symbol throughout the League of the Red Cross Societies; and

WHEREAS, at the same time, the International Committee changed its name to the International Committee of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement, thereby negating its claim of uniformity and bolstering the claim of Israel; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, your Memorialists respectfully recommend and urge the International Committee of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement and the League of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies to fully recognize the Magen David Adom Society; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this Memorial, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to Rabbi Rubin R. Dobin, International Chairman of Operation Recognition, the International Committee of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies and the League of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies.
