THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Washington, Senator Randall.

Senator RANDALL: Thank you Mr. President. Mr. President, men and women of the Senate. I would like to point out to the members of this Chamber that this is a Divided Report from the Committee on Human Resources. Our Committee deliberated on the Report at some length and we came to the conclusion that there was a great deal of difference between where some of the members of the Committee were coming from and where the majority of the members seemed to have settled. The original version of the Bill proposed a Study Commission which was going to be funded at a

level of about five thousand dollars. The proposals you see before you for the study will cost around fourteen thousand, six hundred dollars. That is a considerable change in the cost of this particular study.

The difference between the Committee Amendment "A" and the Committee Amendment "B" is fairly minor. The Committee Amendment "B", which I would support, retains the language of the original Bill allowing for the Commission that is set up to select its own leadership. Committee Amendment "A", which is the Majority Report, on the other hand, has the leadership of the Commission appointed by the Speaker and the President. That is the difference between Committee Amendment "A" and Committee Amendment "B". However, I would like to point out that the individuals who signed onto Committee Amendment "B" felt that they had moved a considerable distance from the version of the language of the original Bill.

Senator RANDALL of Washington requested a Division.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Clark.

Senator CLARK: Thank you Mr. President. Mr. President, men and women of the Senate. I would hope this morning that we would support the pending motion. The good Senator from Washington, Senator Randall, is precise in that the differences between the Report are minor at best.

My understanding is that in Committee Amendment "A", as presented, the Presiding Officer's would name the chair of this Study Commission, thus enabling the Commission to start off running, so to speak. Normally, the first day of a Commission's meeting is spent in organizational duties, an agenda will have been developed if the chair of this Commission has been named and a full day will not be consumed with those kinds of organizational duties. Thank you Mr. President.
