THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Aroostook, Senator LUDWIG.

Senator LUDWIG: Thank you. Mr. President, men and women of the Senate, by no stretch of the imagination could I be considered an economist. I have been known to have trouble balancing my checkbook. But through the years I have done a lot of reading by and about people who were economists, ranging from Adam Smith to John Maynard Keynes, to even Alan Greenspan. I won't say I understood their theories. Let's just say I learned enough to recognize that no two experts agree on the ingredients necessary for a healthy economy. When I feel up to a dose of Louis Rukeyser, I watch "Wall Street Week in Review" in order to see what went wrong last week and what the stock market experts predict for the future. I particularly enjoy the end of the year summary when the regulars are graded according to how accurate their predictions have been during the past twelve months. In all the years I have tuned in, no one has proved infallible. No one has scored one hundred percent. Even Lewis himself would have to admit that his listeners might have been better off had they invested in penny stocks, or junk bonds, or even pork bellies.

The best economic advice I ever received came from my grandfather, "Don't spend more than you have in the bank and set something aside for a rainy day." So I guess you could say that I'm not terribly impressed with professional economists and forecasters. They have yet to prove to me that individual investors or the State for that matter can depend on their predictions.

What we need now is a familiar face, a person of integrity with a well-established background in math

and administration, a former legislator who understands how the system works and the importance of keeping his peers and the public informed as to how much money they will have to provide in order to get the services they demand from the State. I first met Sawin Millett a number of years ago when he was with Maine School Management and I came to Augusta representing several school boards in northern Maine. He impressed me then as highly competent, kindly, courteous and trustworthy. There was nothing flamboyant or phony about the man. In his quiet and down to earth manner, he managed to soothe frayed nerves, reconcile opposing viewpoints and suggest viable solutions to existing conflicts. He was always there when you needed him. He always returned your calls. He listened. I came to know that I could depend on Sawin to give me an honest answer. I came to know that I could trust this man and to me that is the finest compliment that any individual can pay to another. I trust Sawin Millett and when the vote is taken I trust that you will join me in supporting the Governor's nomination of Sawin Millett as Commissioner of Finance. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator ANDREWS.

Senator ANDREWS: Thank you. Mr. President, men and women of the Senate. It is with some trepidation that I stand here today to express my views on this nomination, but I feel it is important that I do. I agree wholeheartedly with the sentiments from the good Senator from Aroostook, Senator Ludwig, regarding this nominee. He is indeed a familiar face, a warm, friendly, familiar face, I might add. Indeed, he does have great integrity and indeed, he has shown a great responsiveness to certainly anyone I am familiar with, certainly myself. As a legislator, whenever I have had a question or a concern or an issue with regard to the Administration, Sawin Millett has done an excellent job in working with me. So, he has my high personal regard and certainly, my respect, and I think that he has done certainly an excellent job in his capacity as legislative liaison for the Governor. But as the Senate Chair of the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation that deals on a regular basis with a Bureau that will come under the direct purview of this nominee, the Bureau of Taxation, as well as other critical functions of state government, the Bureau of the Budget, the Bureau of Accounts and Control, I took an interest in this nominee and the basis for the nomination beyond my personal regard for the nominee and my experience with him as a liaison for the Governor's office. I saw a Department that has faced some extraordinary challenges over the past year, has been facing extraordinary problems over the past year, not only with regard to the more obvious ones, dealing with revenue projections and the problems we've had in those areas, but also with our income tax system and developing a solid system that people understand and can count on and other examples of problems in this troubled Department of Finance. It is, in my view, that we need a Commissioner, not only with integrity, not only someone who we can trust, and certainly, we can trust Sawin Millett, as an individual, as a competent individual, but I think that we need someone, in light of the circumstances that we're facing in this state and in light of the challenges of that Department, that critical Department of state government, that we need someone with a strong, deep and thorough background in the area of finance, in all aspects of finance. Whether it be on the budget side, or the revenue side, or the tax side, we need someone with deep, thorough, grounding skill and knowledge, not only to

communicate, but also to provide leadership, direction for this vital element of state government. As I looked to Mr. Millett's resume and as I looked to the material surrounding this nomination, I could not find, to my satisfaction, that background, that knowledge, that skill, as evidenced by what I saw in that resume and background materials. If, in fact, this was a nomination for Commissioner of Education, and I looked at his outstanding background in education, both as a graduate student, as well as a former Commissioner, as well as a superintendent of schools, as someone with a well strong grounding in all areas of public education, I would have no problem with this nominee. But, this is not the Commissioner of Education, and frankly, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, if Rodney Scribner, who was our former Commissioner and current State Auditor, were nominated to be the Commissioner of Education, I'd have the same problems with that nomination as I have with this one. So, it is for those reasons, that I will be voting to override the Committee's recommendation. Thank you.
