I would just like to tell you a little bit about Norman, I served two terms in the House of Representatives as many of you know and Norm was serving there with me, he recently passed away and I'd like to share with the Senate a story that I found to be moving. We were

sitting in the House chamber a few days before the April filing deadline back in 1984 and I asked him if he was going to run again and he said "well Charlie, I'm not a young man, I've enjoyed my tenure in the Legislature but if statistics hold true I might live another ten years. So the question is do I spend 20% of my life in the Maine Legislature or do I go home and spend it with my family?" He decided at that time not to run for re-election even though everybody who knew Norm knew he would have been re-elected. I always remembered the fact that he decided that being home with his wife and his family and spending time with his grandchildren was more important and perhaps should be more important than serving here. I think we all love this process, we've all enjoyed, those of us who have been here and those who will be here, have enjoyed it but it's refreshing to see candid comments like the one Norm Walker shared with me at that time. Those of us who knew Norm regret his passing but I'm pleased that he spent his final years with his family and so I would ask today that when we adjourn we do so in his memory. Thank you.
