In Senate Chamber Wednesday February 10, 1993

Senate called to Order by the President, Dennis L. Dutremble of York.

SENATOR DALE MCCORMICK: Thank you. Today I will read as the prayer half of Maya Angelou's poem and tomorrow I will read the other half.
