The Following Joint Resolution: H.P. 1126

JOINT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING THE DEFENSE BASE CLOSURE AND REALIGNMENT COMMISSION TO RECONSIDER ITS DECISION TO CLOSE LORING AIR FORCE BASE IN LIMESTONE, MAINE

WE, your Memorialists, the Members of the One Hundred and Sixteenth Legislature of the State of Maine, now assembled in the First Regular Session, most respectfully present and petition the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Commission, as follows:

WHEREAS, because of changes in national defense circumstances since 1991 that the United States Department of Defense has recognized in proposing modification of the 1991 decisions involving air force installations; and

WHEREAS, the closing of Loring Air Force Base was regarded by the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Commission as one of its most difficult decisions; and

WHEREAS, in the Department of Defense's rationale for its 1993 realignment and closure recommendations, the Air Force states that, in the 3 "principal mobility attributes" of geographic location, attributes and base loading capacity, Loring Air Force Base is equal or superior to Plattsburgh Air Force Base; and

WHEREAS, future encroachment and airspace considerations, "principal mobility attributes" cited in the 1993 Department of Defense rationale, were not considered in the 1991 commission's final consideration as a "discriminator" between Plattsburgh Air Force Base and Loring Air Force Base; and

WHEREAS, the number of aircraft that can be parked at Loring Air Force Base and the number of aircraft that can be parked at Plattsburgh Air Force Base are about the same; and

WHEREAS, in 1991, Loring Air Force Base's modern, state-of-the-art "taxi-on taxi-off" refueling system, which is superior to Plattsburgh Air Force Base's refueling system, became operational; and

WHEREAS, Loring Air Force Base has 9,200,000 gallons on-base capacity, while Plattsburgh Air Force Base has capacity for 3,600,000 gallons; and

WHEREAS, both bases also have off-base storage capacity: Loring Air Force Base's storage facility for 43,500,000 gallons is located in Searsport 200 miles away and is connected by pipeline and Plattsburgh Air Force Base's storage facility for 31,500,000 gallons is on leased space 18 miles away; and

WHEREAS, Plattsburgh Air Force Base is subject to quiet hours and encroachment problems as well as questions with capacity and flexibility for expansion while Loring Air Force Base is not encumbered by any of these problems; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, your Memorialists, respectfully recommend and urge the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Commission to reconsider its decision to close Loring Air Force Base in Limestone, Maine; and be it further RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this Memorial, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to each member of the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Commission.

THE **PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Conley.

Senator **CONLEY**: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I realize that this Report represents a unanimous report of the Fisheries Committee and I would like to ask if somebody on the Committee, since I have not had an opportunity to discuss this in my own caucus, might explain exactly what this Bill does. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator from Cumberland, Senator Conley has posed a question through the Chair to any Senator who may care to respond. The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Luther.

Senator **LUTHER:** Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife came to us and asked us to simply give them permission to control the herd, which they would decide what the hunt would be and what numbers would conserve the herd and what numbers would protect public safety. The Committee was not willing to go that far but they did allow them to take 200 more moose the first year, 200 the second and 100 moose the third for a total of 1500 over a period of three years, but they have to report back to the Committee every year so that that can be changed at any time. We felt that was a reasonable compromise. It is also going to expand where the moose hunt can be taken. Certainly, in the western mountains the moose have become a road hazard and I wanted my district included in whatever they decide to do there. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Pearson.

Senator **PEARSON:** Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I'd like to pose a question through the Chair to anyone who may care to answer and that is, is there a sunset on the number of 1500 to revert back to 1000 at the end of the three year period?

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator from Penobscot, Senator Pearson has posed a question through the Chair to any Senator who may care to respond. The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Luther.

Senator **LUTHER:** Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. The Bill is, in effect, sunsetted every year because every year they must come back to the Committee and every year the Committee can change that number. So yes it is. It can sunset to less than 1000 if that is what the resource demands. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Pearson.

Senator **PEARSON:** Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. What I want to know is does it legally go back to the number of 1000 automatically at the end of the three years? Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Luther.

Senator **LUTHER:** Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. No it does not. It is going to be decided by the Department what the resource is good for and then the Committee will make a decision in conjunction with the biologists and the Department. Thank you.

Senator **CONLEY** of Cumberland requested a Division.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Conley.

Senator **CONLEY:** Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. This debate has gone back many years in reference to how hunting of moose will be conducted in this State. As I recall when a long hard battle was fought to get 1000 permits, one which was waged here for a number of years, at that time, I believe, a promise was made that no more than 1000 permits would ever be sought, and that problems that occur in some of the areas such as the good Senator's from Oxford, involving these districts in which there have been more accidents involving moose, it is my understanding that the Department already has the authority to allow more moose to be taken, within the 1000 limit, from that particular district. I believe at this time to increase in anyway, to allow the number of permits to increase in reference to the taking of moose, is a violation of that trust and I would be opposed to it.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Carpenter.

Senator **CARPENTER**: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. York County is not in a moose hunting district so therefore there is no legal method of thinning the herd that we have in York County. I believe this Bill should be passed in order to control the moose population. Sanford, Maine is about as close as you can get to the ocean, and even York and Wells and Biddeford, we are having more and more incidents of moose accidents, motorcycles, automobiles, falling into swimming pools. I like the moose, I love to look at them but I don't need it in my swimming pool or on the hood of my automobile and I believe we should support this Bill. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Conley.

Senator **CONLEY:** Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. If we were to follow that logic, there are also a lot of pedestrians who get hit by cars on a yearly basis and I assume we're not going to take them out and shoot them. When it comes to moose I don't think anybody is kidding anybody here, it is the only game animal known to man or woman that you can actually have your picture taken with before you shoot it. If we are going to gradually increase these permits to allow the taking of these moose, and nobody is kidding anybody here, it's really a way for the Department to gather resources, to get money, through the lottery and the number of permits. I just think it's wrong and I don't think we should be increasing our revenues in this State by attracting that type of money. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Carpenter.

Senator **CARPENTER:** Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Following that logic we would apply for permits to eliminate pedestrians. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Piscataquis, Senator Hall.

Senator HALL: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. The Department, under the present statute, does indeed have the authority to declare where they will have the most permits issued. The problem at this present time is if they shift that around to a particular area that is having a lot of moose vehicle collisions than that will simply increase the moose herd in another area. This is happening all over the State basically. We're paying good money for professionals to manage a particular resource here. If we do not listen to those management people then why have them? Why have them? They are saying that the moose population definitely could sustain having more moose taken. I think the safeguards are definitely built into this particular Bill so that we can control it. The only other way that we could, or the State could, eliminate some of these moose along the highway is through a scientific collectors permit. I can assure you that if we send Game Wardens out there to shoot moose on the highways that we would be in trouble. I don't think the public would stand for that. This is a renewable resource as long as it is managed properly, it will continue to be there, there are plenty of moose around for anyone who wants to go photographing or videoing or anything they want to do. I wouldn't want it any other way but please listen to the professionals. They know more than you and I and I think we should give them a chance. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Cleveland.

Senator **CLEVELAND**: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I want to thank the good Senator from Cumberland for bringing this to our attention. I know this has been an awful issue in our area and I've been waiting the entire session to have an opportunity to debate this issue. I'm glad it hasn't gotten in the way of the budget discussions, or that the budget hasn't gotten in the way of this discussion. I know in the Lewiston Auburn area we have been having quite a lot of trouble with moose. They come into our backyards, swim in our pools, sit on our patio furniture, block the intersections and get in the way of the drive up window at Dunkin' Donuts, so I hope, as they are allocating these additional permits, that they will certainly consider the problem in the Auburn and Lewiston area because it's certainly holding up economic development. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Summers.

Senator **SUMMERS:** Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. In light of the remarks of my good friend from Androscoggin, I'm wondering if maybe we could delay this for a few minutes and get a Joint Resolution together to send down to the Fish and Wildlife Department. Thank you.

THE **PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Pearson.

Senator **PEARSON:** Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. The President of the Senate and I, I think I'm not sure but I think, were the only two, and Senator Vose, that when the original debate took place were here. We were given assurances at the time that 1000 was what was necessary to have and there were people who got up and said this is just a foot in the door, they're going to want more, and the answer to that was no, no, no. We won't want more. This is it. Ever since then every two years there's been some Bill in to increase the amount of moose that can be taken. Every single time the argument is always advanced that it is because of traffic problems, people are getting hit in their automobile and everything. That does happen once or twice a year, it also happens with a lot of other things in life, like the good Senator from Cumberland said, pedestrians, deer and everything else. That's the excuse that has been used. I'm really not buying it myself. I think 1000 is enough. I might be able to stretch my mind a little bit if it had a sunset or if the Committee had said we have a particular problem around Route 11, or we've got a particular problem in western Maine. Like the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Conley, said, they could allocate more permits in that particular area if there is a nuisance being caused by these particular animals. It's pretty transparent to me it's just a method of raising money and I don't think we ought to be doing that to the State's animal. Thank you.

THE **PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Luther.

Senator LUTHER: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. If we want to belabor this Bill then we'll do it but I think probably everybody has got their mind all made up on how they will vote on the Division. When they promised 1000 moose and no more I was not here but I think that anyone can see the situation has changed and the moose became an actual danger, not just to traffic but what about other animals. Deer do not thrive very well where there are moose and we have reached a point where we need to cull more than 1000 from the herd. I deeply, deeply, resent the implication that's been made here that we are selling the moose for money. That is not true. That was not the intent of the Committee. The intent of the Committee is to let the professionals manage the herd. Thank you.

Off Record Remarks

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Kieffer.

Senator **KIEFFER:** Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I represent an area that probably has as many moose as there are in any area of the State. I also firmly believe that we hire biologists for a reason. This Bill, it seems to me, allows the limit to be reduced below 1000 as well as it allows it to be gradually increased above 1000. It might very well be 300 if we listen to our biologists. If we're not going to listen to them then I suggest we get rid of them. When I first started fishing the limit on trout was 25 now it's down to 5, now that limit was not changed here in this body, it was changed by the Department on the advice of the Fisheries biologists. If we aren't going to listen to them let's get rid of them. Thank you.

On motion by Senator **LUTHER** of Oxford, supported by a Division of one-fifth of the members present and voting, a Roll Call was ordered.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Piscataquis, Senator Hall.

Senator HALL: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. One more item I would like to mention to you and you are right as far as everything that went on to obtain a moose season. I was very much involved in that work with the Department at that time. The point I want to make, prior to having that season, we had a lot of disease among the moose herd in this State called the Meningeal Worm. Once we started having a season that went down, as the moose herd increases I can assure you that's coming back. If we do not allow the taking of more moose you will see this spead and mother nature will kill them off. I can also assure you that is not a pleasant way for any animal to die. I would urge the passage of this Bill. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Somerset, Senator Cianchette.

Senator **CIANCHETTE:** Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I feel compelled to get involved in this moose mania that we are dealing with this morning. As Senator Pearson was reminiscing I'd like to reminisce back a little further. Twenty years ago, probably about today, we were debating the moose bill in this body, which I was a member of. Senator Greeley, from Waldo, was seated where Senator Carey of Kennebec sits now. He and I led a charge and denied the permits to hunt moose twenty years ago. Eighteen years ago we understood early on in the session that this moose hunting licensing bill was going to be coming up and early in the session Senator Greeley and I went around the body and we had something like 23 solid commitments that they would not vote for the moose bill. That year they had a tremendous hearing, I think they held it in the Civic Center, there were hundreds of people who came and testified on why and why we should not have moose hunting permits. It went through that whole process and when it came to the Senate there were 23 votes against the moose hunting bill. That year I got out of the Senate, that was the last year I served and Senator Greeley served one more year and without my help he lost, and we had the moose hunting bill. I just thought everybody would like to know that history. Thank you.

Senator **LUTHER** of Oxford requested and received leave of the Senate to withdraw her motion for a Roll Call.

THE PRESIDENT: The pending question before the Senate is PASSAGE TO BE ENGROSSED AS AMENDED, in concurrence.

The amendment before the body was really sort of unrelated to it but was part of the original bill and was really the most important part of the bill. What this amendment would allow is right now Maine breweries can hold taste testing festivals within the State of Maine as a chance for them to get together and show of their wares, so to speak. The reason this bill came forward is that some breweries within the State wanted to bring in breweries from outside of the State and have an international or a national festival. One of these events recently occurred in Boston which was a great economic boon for that city and to me it sounded like a good idea for the State of Maine. It would give us a chance to really do something, at least in this little small area for economic development, I know those are the two key words you have to use in reference to any bill these days to get anybody to pay attention. In any case I tried to talk to the good Senator from Piscataquis, Senator Hall, this morning about the amendment. I know he hasn't had an opportunity to digest it shall we say, and if somebody would like to Table the bill so that he does have a chance to do that I would certainly understand and appreciate it. If not I would hope that the body would go along with adopting this amendment since I did meet with the entire Committee. Thank you.
