WHEREAS, Mr. Scribner was often referred to as "Mr. Republican," having served in many leadership capacities in the Republican Party; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Scribner was widely known and highly regarded for his sensitivity to the needs of family, friends and associates and was also well-known for his kindness, honesty, grace and humor; and

WHEREAS, Fred Scribner's unique record of public service and dedication merits the special gratitude of his colleagues and of the citizens of this State; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Sixteenth Legislature of the State of Maine now assembled in the Second Regular Session, take this opportunity to express our sorrow at the passing of Fred C. Scribner, Jr.; and be it further

RESOLVED: That our membership pause in a moment of understanding and prayer to inscribe this token of sympathy and condolence to all who share our sorrow at the passing of Fred C. Scribner, Jr. and respectfully request that when the Legislature adjourns this date it do so in honor and lasting tribute to the memory of Fred C. Scribner, Jr.; and be it further

THE PRESIDENT PRO TEM: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Amero.

Senator AMERO: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I rise today to speak in memory and in honor of Fred C. Scribner, Jr. who passed away last week at the age of 86 years. Mr. Scribner has long been known in Maine circles as Mr. Republican, a title which he certainly earned and one which he certainly enjoyed. Fred Scribner served during the Eisenhower administration as the Under Secretary of the Treasury, he was also general counsel to the National Republican Committee. He presided over several Maine Republican conventions and was responsible for putting together the 1956 National Republican Convention in San Diego. Mr. Scribner loved the political process, so much so that ten years ago he agreed to serve on Maine's Reapportionment Commission. He was very proud of the fact that that Reapportionment Commission, unlike others, was able to come to an agreement on reapportionment, one that could pass through the Legislature and he has always given great credit to our President Pro Tem, Senator Baldacci, for making that all possible.

Fred Scribner also took deep interest in my own political campaign for the State Senate. So much so that he called me one day after I had announced my decision to run for this body, and asked that I have lunch with him so that he could give me his years of wisdom and advice on how to run a political campaign. After having lunch and walking down Congress Street, back to his office, he suddenly stooped over, and he was at that time not very steady on his feet and I wondered what was happening. He bent over because he saw a penny on the ground. He picked it up and said this is good luck, take this and remember that your campaign is off to a good start. That was my first contribution, one penny.

Besides politics and government, Fred Scribner loved his work with his law firm. His work ethics are legend. He worked right up until the time that he died. He commanded respect of the legal community not only in Maine, but beyond our borders. He was a pillar in the Episcopal church, a leader in the Boy Scouts organization, and a great family man. I ask you to join me today in honoring the memory of Fred C. Scribner, Jr., one of Maine's outstanding citizens. I also respectfully request that when the Legislature adjourns today that we do so in memory of Fred C. Scribner, Jr. of Falmouth. Thank you.
