THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Pearson.

Senator **PEARSON**: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. It was my motion a week ago that this be placed in the Appropriations and Financial Affairs Committee. As you can see, it came from the House with that body having Adhered to placing it in Human Resources. I did not know that the Majority Leader was going to make the motion that he just did, it is fine with me but I would like to explain to you something about this, just so I will feel good about it. There was some difficulty here just a little while ago with regard to people in nursing homes who had gone out of the nursing homes, maybe temporarily, say to a hospital, and then were making an attempt to go back to a nursing home and there was, as I understand the issue anyway, there are some people who are being told they may not be able to go back to the nursing homes. An attempt was made to make sure that that was clarified so that these people wouldn't feel threatened if they went into the hospital. Senator Foster from Hancock, in our Committee, lead the way in trying to clarify that particular issue. We had first thought that we would have to generate a Bill from our Committee to deal with that. We have been given some assurances from the Department that that will not be necessary and that they will try to clarify that with the nursing homes. Frankly, the jury is out and we will see what happens. That was contained in this Bill which has been the subject of some difficulty with reference. That was a small part of it, that was the immediate reason for dealing with it, however attached to this Bill, and the reason why it was of some concern to us, is \$15 million more in this particular account. The Bill will be headed for Human Resources but eventually it will be coming back for \$15 million, give or take a few million dollars. In our view it was mostly a financial matter because where is the \$15 million? The issue will be discussed as we get closer, probably at the very end of the session. It was our view that the Committee on Appropriations, given the money situation that we had, probably ought to look at this. I guess the way the cards are being dealt here we will be looking at it later. Thank you.
