JOINT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO EXTEND THE MAINE TERRITORIAL SEA LIMITS FROM 3 MILES TO 12 MILES

WHEREAS, We, your Memorialists, the Members of the One Hundred and Sixteenth Legislature of the State of Maine now assembled in the Second Regular Session, most respectfully present and petition the members of Congress of the United States, as follows:

WHEREAS, the current territorial sea limit for the State of Maine is 3 miles; and

WHEREAS, waters within the 3-mile territorial sea limit are regulated by the State of Maine with respect to marine fisheries and the waters outside the 3-mile territorial sea limit are not within the jurisdiction of the State; and

WHEREAS, the United States Government has extended territorial limits to 12 miles for purposes other than marine fisheries; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, your Memorialists, respectfully recommend and urge the Congress of the United States to extend the territorial sea limit of the State of Maine from 3 miles to 12 miles for the purposes of marine fisheries so that the State of Maine can more effectively manage its marine fisheries resources; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this Memorial, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the Honorable William J. Clinton, President of the United States, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States and to each member of the Maine Congressional Delegation.

JOINT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING THE HONORABLE REPRESENTATIVES OLYMPIA SNOWE AND THOMAS ANDREWS TO BECOME COSPONSORS OF HOUSE REPORT 3392, THE SAFE DRINKING WATER ACT AMENDMENTS OF 1993

WE, your Memorialists, the Members of the One Hundred and Sixteenth Legislature of the State of Maine, now assembled in the Second Regular Session, most respectfully present and petition the Representatives of the Maine Congressional Delegation, as follows:

WHEREAS, community water systems in the State are required to spend in excess of \$400,000,000 to comply with federal regulations resulting from the Safe Drinking Water Act Amendments of 1986; and

WHEREAS, the Safe Drinking Water Act Amendments of 1986 require the arbitrary establishment of 25 new drinking water standards every 3 years, resulting in increased monitoring costs; and

WHEREAS, the Safe Drinking Water Act Amendments of 1986 will result in regulation requiring the removal of contaminants to levels well below that required to protect human health, resulting in millions of dollars being spent unnecessarily on new physical plants and their operation; and

WHEREAS, the Safe Drinking Water Act Amendments of 1986 do not provide any flexibility in monitoring requirements based on community location, thus requiring the monitoring and expenses for that monitoring for contaminants that are not now and never were in this State; and

WHEREAS, the reforms proposed in House Report 3392 will rectify these problems, resulting in millions of dollars of savings for the people of this State, while at the same time advancing public health protection through effective and efficient regulation of public water systems; and

WHEREAS, House Report 3392 has the support of the Maine Water Utilities Association, the Maine Rural Water Association, the National Governors Association, the National League of Cities, the United States Conference of Mayors, the National Association of Counties, the National Conference of State Legislatures, the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners, the Association of Metropolitan Water Agencies, the National Association of Water Companies, the Natural Rural Water Association, the National Water Resources Association, the American Water Works Association and the Association of State Drinking Water Administrators; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, your Memorialists, respectfully recommend and urge the Honorable Representatives Olympia Snowe and Thomas Andrews to not only support, but also cosponsor House Report 3392; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this Memorial, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to each Member of the Maine Congressional Delegation.

Dear Mr. President and Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Title 5, Maine Revised Statutes Annotated, Section 1547, the accompanying Financial Report of the State of Maine is submitted for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1993.

The first section of the report consists of the General Purpose Financial Statements for all funds reported in accordance with generally accepted accounting Principles. Generally accepted accounting principles for the Governmental Funds uses the modified accrual basis of accounting. Revenues are recognized when they become measurable and available as current assets. Expenditures are generally recognized when the related fund liability is incurred. Exceptions to generally accepted accounting principles in these financial statements include accumulated unpaid vacation and sick leave which has not been recorded, and interest on general long-term debt which is recognized when due.

The second section is reported, as it has been in the past, based upon the budgetary and legal requirements. Please refer to Note 2 of the General Notes to the Financial Statements for the reconciliation of the fund balances between the two sections. Comparative budgetary data and statistical information have also been included in this report to promote a better understanding of the State's finances.

Questions and comments about this report or any phase of State finances are always welcome.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Lincoln, Senator Begley.

Senator **BEGLEY:** Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I will ask for a Division on this item if I may. The exemption of a particular Commission from furlough and shutdown days does not necessarily give equity across the governmental board. It is also true that the Labor Relations contract is going to phase out furlough days and shutdown days. So this Bill, in my estimation is not needed. Thank you.

Senator BEGLEY of Lincoln requested a Division.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Washington, Senator Vose.

Senator **VOSE**: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. This Bill was held over from last year in hopes that the new contract would eliminate the furlough days for those employees. I will admit that that is being phased out and hopefully will be ended once and for all. However, the persons working at the Public Utilities Commission have no effect whatsoever on the General Fund. I understood the purpose of the furlough days was to help out the General Fund, in other words we would save money by days off. These people who are working over there are very important. They have a job to do to protect the ratepayers. Our Committee felt very strongly that they should be exempt from this particular provision. I know that there are exemptions made for emergencies, such as the State Police etc., but I don't see any particular emergency in the State liquor stores, so there has been a precedent made for people who are doing a good job for the State of Maine and have no adverse affect on the General Fund. I would hope that you would pass this Bill. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Carpenter.

Senator **CARPENTER:** Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Originally when this Bill was first proposed and voted out of Committee, I voted in favor of it, now that they have gone through the State's bargaining unit and have reached an agreement where furlough days will, in fact, be phased out, I do not think that it is really necessary any more and I will vote against the Bill. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The pending question before the Senate is ${\bf ENACTMENT}.$

Senator LAMRENCE: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I have been reading over this Joint Resolution and while I think the intent of the Resolution is laudable I have some questions about whether or not we, as a Senate, should be instructing members of the Congress as to what Bills they should or should not be cosponsoring. As I understand this legislation that is before the Congress may directly affect some water districts and some people within the State, those are the people who should be contacting Congresswoman Snowe and Congressman Andrews about their cosponsorship. I am concerned that we don't know enough about this issue to instruct them whether or not they should be cosponsoring it and that it is not something that directly affects this State. While it affects people in this State, it doesn't directly affect the State of Maine and I would request that this item be Indefinitely Postponed. Thank you.

Senator ESTY of Cumberland moved to INDEFINITELY POSTPONE in NON-CONCURRENCE.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Bustin.

Senator **BUSTIN**: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. While I agree with the Indefinite Postponement, I am one of the cosponsors of this Resolution and the reason why I am one of the cosponsors is because my municipality in Augusta asked me if I would please do something to help them relieve the heavy financial burden that they are looking at in trying to meet the Safe Drinking Water Act standards. Where I totally agree with the Safe Drinking Water Act standards the financial burdens that have been imposed on municipalities, and if it hasn't hit yours it will, I think needs to be addressed, perhaps not in this manner, but it needs to be addressed. It is not just a United States Congress issue, it absolutely affects you and your municipalities very intimately. I hope that this legislature is willing to address this issue in some other form in this legislature. Thank you.

Senator **VOSE**: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I have just been reading this and it is my recollection that there were two Bills concerning this. One was originated in the Senate and the other may have originated in the House, I believe that this is addressing the Bill that may have been originated in the House which is by far the better Bill for the people of the State of Maine as I recall. I'm not that familiar with the whole situation but I did get a letter from Senator Mitchell to comment on the Senate Bill and what little I read on the Bill it appeared to me that it was going to cost the State of Maine an arm and a leg if that Bill passed in the Senate. If they are referring to the Bill that may originate in the House I feel very strongly that we should indicate our

support for this particular Bill. Therefore, I would ask someone to Table this until we can take a look and see just which Bill they are referring to. Thank you.

I am probably going to vote for this budget but over some very serious objections because I do know that I do not think that we have followed the procedure that we agreed to follow last year and the year before in making sure that what is in the budget is what needs to be in the budget. There are some serious flaws that hopefully can be repaired after this budget is passed. There are some serious flaws and one of the most specific ones is the overtime issue in the Department of Corrections. We are looking at perhaps not being able to staff the post that are there if we can't make some adjustments. There is some very legitimate consideration about how overtime is paid for, how overtime is billed, why we need to use so much of it, and these need to be addressed. The Appropriations Committee has asked and has not gotten a response from the appropriate people in order to make their needs known as to why they are asking for that amount of overtime. I, as the Chair of Corrections, will be doing my very best to try to institute a process where we can get the answers to those questions and hopefully we will have them so that when we have another chance at a budget in this legislative session we will be able to resolve the issue of the overtime and get some control over it. Even though I think that we should be funding the overtime amount that has been requested by the Executive in this budget, I will be voting for it and hopefully we can repair the damage that has been done in the next budget. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Esty.

Senator **ESTY**: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I would just like to take this opportunity to point out to all of the members of this Senate that this is a unanimous recommendation from the Appropriations Committee, one that we haven't seen for a budget in recent times. I would just like to take one moment, even though it is a 1994 budget, to applaud all three members of the Senate who serve on the Appropriations Committee for coming together with a unanimous report to present to us. You have worked hard, we expect in the 1995 budget that will be forthcoming that the same kinds of efforts will take place so that we can see another unanimous report come before this Senate.
