To The Honorable Members of the 116th Legislature:

I am returning, without my signature or approval, S.P. 119, L.D. 357, "An Act to Exempt Employees of the Public Utilities Commission from Furlough and Shutdown Days." This bill would provide for an exemption to the furlough days and shutdown days for Public Utilities Commission employees. As a matter of equity to all State employees, this bill should not become law.

In addition to the principle of fairness, it should also be noted that furlough and shutdown days will soon be an issue of the past. New contracts were entered into during the most recent negotiations that provided for a two year period beginning July, 1993, expiring June 30, 1995. There was no agreement to exempt any employees during these negotiations, nor was there any distinction in application based upon occupational work or funding source.

The collective bargaining agreements covering the employees working at the Public Utilities Commission during FY 93/94 provide for ten shutdown days, six of which have already been taken. The total number of shutdown days for FY 94/95 is only five. All shutdown days will be concluded at the expiration of these agreements. Because of these changes, I do not support an exemption.

Any exemption from shutdown days for the Public Utilities Commission employees could result in a lack of understanding and frustration by other employees who are not exempted. With furlough days and shutdown days quickly phasing out, I cannot support an exemption. I hope you will join me in rejecting this piece of legislation.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

The following matters in the consideration of which the Senate was engaged at the time of Recess, have preference in the Orders of the Day and continue with such preference until disposed of as provided by Senate Rule 29.

The Chair laid before the Senate the Accompanying Bill:

"An Act to Exempt Employees of the Public Utilities Commission from Furlough and Shutdown Days" S.P. 119 L.D. 357 (C "B" S-390)

(In Senate, March 1, 1994, Veto Communication **READ** and **ORDERED PLACED ON FILE**.)

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Cleveland.

Senator CLEVELAND: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Before we have the opportunity to cast our ballot on this I would like to take an opportunity to share a few thoughts about this particular proposal with you as a sponsor of the proposal. I fully understand, of course, that given the nature of the institution, and I'm not deluded at all at what the outcome will be, that we will probably vote pretty much by party lines, so my remarks may not change the outcome, but I think for historical perspective it is important to know that there is merit to this position, and that it was not offered in a cavalier or thoughtless way. The concern about exempting PUC employees from furlough days is really the basis of a philosophical difference. This proposal has passed both bodies twice and is here before us again. It has to do with providing the necessary resources with an essential agency to deal with critical utility issues during a difficult time in energy pricing and policy in this

State. Requiring these individuals to take a significant number of days off is a detriment to the public interest. As all of you know, I hope, the cost of the Public Utilities Commission is paid through a dedicated fund, it is not paid through general funds, so any reduction by shutdowns do not benefit, in any way, the general fund.

Further, the issue of exempting employees is not a new issue in this State. Teachers in unorganized territories have been exempted, the State Police have been exempted, liquor store employees have been exempted, that certainly is a critical service that requires exemption. All of the employees in the Department of Labor in regards to the unemployment compensation work have been exempted. Those have already occured and are exempted now. The fact that we have a request for a new group of employees to meet a critical need is not a precedent setting area. Furthermore, as has already occured by the exemption of these other employees, there has been no mad rush by other employees to ask for exemptions either, nor has there been any noticeable detrimental effect on the moral or any individuals because all of these other employees have been exempted. It is a question of where do we provide a resource to meet critical needs in this State. There are only a few additional days left, the Legislature is closely coming to an end, so the Legislature is not going to introduce any more bills to exempt employees, that would be up to the Executive branch to do that. The arguments that somehow this will affect employees, that it will encourage additional requests for exemptions, are specious arguments. Those will not occur, they have not occured in the past, this is not a precedent setting process, it is just an opportunity by which we can provide necessary resources with no impact on the general fund whatsoever to meet critical needs of utility issues today. That is the reason why it was introduced, that is the reason why it got bipartisan support in the Committee, that is the reason why it has passed both houses and I would hope that we could override the judgement of the Governor and do something that is to the benefit of the citizens of this State. Thank you.
