Many of my constituents have voiced concerns about International Paper's violation of many environmental laws, and in fact I don't have independent confirmation of this, but some don't have independent confirmation of this, but some felt that International Paper was actually one of the leaders in the nation in the category of environmental violations. Which is certainly not something I would think a company would want to be a leader in. On the other hand, I also have a good friend and constituent, Gerry Bligh, who testified in

favor of Mr. Lovaglio and who counts him as a personal friend. He relayed to me this morning that he thinks he is a straight shooter, an independent thinker, and someone who is not afraid of challenging the status quo, someone who has the stature to bring the paper companies along to some forward looking conservation policies. So, I would like to just urge Mr. Lovaglio to make the transition from his old position to this new position in which he holds in his hands the environment of the State of Maine and to grow into that position. We will give him the help he needs in doing that. Thank you.

Senator HARRIMAN of Cumberland moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT and ORDERED PRINTED.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Pendexter.

Senator **PENDEXTER**: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I would ask that you vote against reference to the Business and Economic Development Committee in regards to this item. This is a bill that was in our Committee last session and as you can probably already predict it is very controversial because it has the name pharmaceuticals in it. The minute we start talking about that "p" word around here then the politics start. Unfortunately we are already in trouble with the reference. I just want to share two thoughts with you on why I feel this bill should remain in the Human Resources Committee. The argument on the other side states that this is a trade issue, it is a pricing issue and has nothing to do with health care and has nothing to do with Human Services. I would like to just remind you of two things. First of all,

when you start talking about discount pricing, it is a direct result of HMO's, it is a direct result of the Home Managed Care situation that we find ourselves in and I would argue with you that the Human Resources Committee is the Committee that has the understanding of HMO's and has the understanding of all of the managed care issues. So for that first reason I would ask you to refer this bill to Human Resources. The other argument I would make is the health care market is like no other market. People are trying to make the argument that this is a trade issue but the health care market is like no other market. I would argue with you that the people on the Human Resources Committee are the people who have the better understanding and would be able to do justice to this bill. So I would ask you to vote against the motion to refer this to the Business and Economic Development Committee. Mr. President, I request a Roll Call. Thank you.

On motion by Senator **PENDEXTER** of Cumberland, supported by a Division of one-fifth of the members present and voting, a Roll Call was ordered.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Harriman.

Senator HARRIMAN: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. While I would not quarrel with my good friend from Cumberland, Senator Pendexter, that this issue does revolve around issues of managed care. It does revolve around the issues surrounding pharmaceuticals. I would ask you to consider the fact that this is a matter of public interest as it relates to the pricing, the business practices, and to my way of thinking, this is a business issue. It is an issue that surrounds public policy on the marketing and pricing of products in this state and is best served by bringing it to the Committee of jurisdiction that has responsibility for these issues. So I hope you would support the pending motion. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Bustin.

Senator BUSTIN: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. You may note that I am a sponsor of this bill. I just want to give you a little bit of history. This bill, if you want to consider a Committee of jurisdiction, this bill originated, or the cause for having this bill, originated from the Human Services Committee. They, in fact, pushed this piece of legislation through up in Human Resources and it came down to us to be argued on the floor of the Senate, without what I consider an adequate hearing. I think that it should go back there for that adequate hearing to see what the people really do think about unitary pricing for drugs. One of the most important reasons why it should go to the Human Resources Committee is because it is a health issue. It directly affects how much your group health policies are going to be paying for their prescription drugs. So, it becomes a very real health issue and should be handled in the Human Resources Committee. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The pending question before the Senate is the motion of Senator HARRIMAN of Cumberland to REFER the bill to the Committee on BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

A vote of Yes will be in favor of **REFERRING** the bill to the Committee on **BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**.

A vote of No will be opposed.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Knox, Senator Pingree.

Senator **PINGREE**: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I rise today to speak briefly on the supplemental budget that we are about to pass on behalf of my Democratic Caucus. I will be voting for today's supplemental budget and I must say, as I do so, that we are behaving somewhat

financially irresponsibly. First, I feel that we are removing a health care safety net for 2700 people in the State of Maine who have come to depend on it. We are also, in deciding to no longer support the Maine Health Program, sending back approximately \$800,000 to federal government. While it is popular now to say that we are not going to be on the federal dole and this is money that we are not going to be dependent on, I read last week in Mike Brown's column that we send \$3 billion a year in income taxes to Washington. Until they start sending me back my income taxes I am concerned about sending back this money. I think it is hard for 2700 people to understand this abstract commitment that we no longer want to participate in federal programs when they are thinking about the fact that they will no longer be covered under this program. One thing that I am sure of is 2700 people will continue to get sick and these costs will continue to be shifted to our hospitals through emergency rooms, to all working people who have health insurance and pay these bills, and to small businesses who now pay 30% more than what is the actual cost of coverage to cover the uninsured in this State. I must say that, while we are disappointed that we are unable to continue this program and that we are unable now to look toward a federal waiver for a broader coverage and to solving what I think is an economic problem for the State of Maine, we are pleased that we have received a commitment from the Governor and from many of our colleagues to attempt to send a bill to the Human Resources Committee to look towards sending the \$200,000 that was removed from the Maine Health Program to prescription drugs for this population until the end of the fiscal year, and that our new Commissioner, Kevin Concannon, will be actively looking towards a Medicaid waiver that will look into the future of how we are going to manage the cost of a large population of uninusured people, how we will look at managed care in this State and how we will look at controlling medical costs and how we will, for once and for all, admit to ourselves that health care is not something that we give away when we have extra dollars and everything is going well. The fact that we do not have good health care coverage in this State is a cost to us, it is an economic cost to us and it hurts us as much as every other problem we have with our economy. So I will be voting for this budget today. I am disappointed that we are taking the course that we are taking but I am hopeful that we are going to make a commitment in the future to work together to solve this problem. Thank you.

On motion by Senator RAND of Cumberland, supported by a Division of one-fifth of the members present and voting, a Roll Call was ordered.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Hathaway.

Senator HATHAMAY: Thank you Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I would like to thank the good Senator from Knox, Senator Pingree, for her well-chosen words. I, for one, certainly want to let you know that your message is a good one. I think there is another message that I would like to make sure is heard today and that is that if we are going to begin to restore the trust between the people of the State of Maine and their government, which I think we badly need to do, I'm

afraid we need to immediately stop using the gimmicks that we have heard so much about in the last few months in trying to balance our budgets. I am afraid that I think today that we are continuing using, in this budget, more gimmicks and are once again not bridging that gap between the trust between the people in the State of Maine that we so sorely need to repair. We are, in fact, using what I call several gimmicks in this budget that once again ask the people of the State of Maine to burden themselves with more taxes. For us in this chamber to be using them for purposes other than what we told them they would be used for, I would hope that beginning today, from this day forward, that we would commit to no longer do that. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The pending question before the Senate is ${\bf ENACTMENT}$.

A vote of Yes will be in favor of ENACTMENT.

A vote of No will be opposed.
